Gates of Millinocket with a dangerous weapon. In addition to this news was received here Wednesday by Clerk of Courts Charles F. Sweet that the law court has ruled adversely on his motion for a new trial on the charge of rescuing a prisoner from an officer. McLeod was convicted of this offence at the February term last year, but at once took an appeal. McLeod now fears that he will have to stand sentence on both charges. McLeod has long been reckoned as one of the most lawless inhabitants of Millinocket. He may now get a long term in prison.—Bangor Commercial.
