NYACK, N. Y., December 29. — The end of the world did not come yesterday as Lee J. Spangler, a local prophet, had predicted, it would, but the prophet himself disappeared at 4 o'clock yesterday morning and since then has not been seen.

Spangler, it is said, cautioned all the "saints" of his sect to be watchful for the great event, for yesterday, surely, would see the end of the world. Therefore a crowd of women followers, dressed in white, went to Oak Hill cemetery this morning to await the event, but the superintendent of the burying ground drove them out.

Scores of other adherents of Spangler climbed Smith Mountain, where the "prophet" had promised to meet them, saying there together they could view the passing away of the Mother Earth; but as the hours passed and the predicted phenomenon did not take place and Spangler himself did not appear, they plodded their way down the mountain, many of them with looks of disgust on their faces.

TRIED TO KILL WRIGHT.

LEBANON, France, Dec. 29. — Just before making a flight today, Wilbur Wright, the American aeroplaneist, discovered that some one had filled the oil box of his aeroplane with gasoline. The discovery probably prevented a serious accident. Subsequently Mr. Wright gave a remarkable exhibition in the presence of a large number of spectators, including M. Barthou, the Minister of Public Works.

GETTING IT UNDER CONTROL.

BUFFALO, N. Y., Dec. 29. — No case of foot and mouth disease has been found in New York State in the last nineteen days and both the State and City departments are confident that it is under control now.

HOW PRICES RANGE IN CALGARY

CALGARY, Dec. 28. — Following are some of the prices of the Calgary Christmas market: hay per ton, six to eight dollars; oats per bushel, thirty cents to thirty five cents; butter per lb., thirty to thirty five cents; eggs per doz., sixty cents; turkey per lb., twenty to twenty five cents; turkeys five, two dollars and twenty five to two dollars and seventy five; chickens each sixty cents; ducks per pair, one dollar and fifty cents; beef five and a half to six and a half cents; pork eight to nine cents.

FAMINE FEARED IN NEWS PRINT PAPER

GLEN FALLS, N. Y., Dec. 29. — That a famine in the news print paper market is likely to result from continuance of the recent drought in paper-making territory, is indicated in statements made today by officials of the International Paper Company. Many mills which have been compelled to run on short time in several departments, owing to low water will have to shut down entirely in four weeks unless rain falls, the officials say.

Such a shut-down, owing to the fact that the Company has no reserve supply of finished paper, would, it is said, cut off shipments to a number of big dailies. Low water is prevalent in all paper mill towns of the country.

The shut-down, should it occur, would result in thousands of men who only recently resumed work after being out on strike for three months, being laid off.

ONTARIO SAVES \$75,000 BY DEPORTATION OF 18 PERSONS.

TORONTO, Dec. 29. — By the deportation of eighteen persons in November, it is estimated that a total saving to the Province of \$75,000 has been made. Of the eighteen persons dealt with, six were admitted to asylums within two years of their arrival in Canada, one within a year, two within three years, two within four years, two within five years, two within six years, one in seven years, one in eight years, and one after twenty-one years residence.

STRIKE IN BOSTON.

BOSTON, Dec. 29. — Some three hundred and fifty union employees of the George W. Harvey Company, builders employed on the Boston Opera House and a new hotel structure on Commonwealth Avenue, were ordered out on strike today, as it was claimed non-union men were also working on the jobs.

Mr. Harvey stated tonight that there would be no cessation of the work on account of the order.
