THE PORTUGUESE SITUATION SERIOUS. (Canadian Press.) MADRID, July 8.—Premier Canalejas declared in an interview today that the strictest orders will be given to prevent the Portuguese conspiracies from being arranged on Spanish territory.

He said all leaders and accomplices would be arrested. Spain was considerably inconvenienced by an interrupting in the telegraph service owing to the uprising in Portugal but it is believed here that the movement is of little importance and has already virtually collapsed.

PASSENGERS HELD IN QUARANTINE. (Canadian Press.) PHILADELPHIA, July 8.—When the American Line steamship Haverton arrived at Delaware Breakwater today from Liverpool, via Queens-town for Philadelphia, 413 steerage passengers taken off the vessel by the United States Quarantine official and landed at the government hospital at Lewisdel, where they will be kept under observation for a possible outbreak of contagious diseases, especially smallpox.

The passengers may be detained a week.
