AERIAL BATTLE IS WAGED OVER MADRID RIOTOUS SCENES IN FRENCH CHAMBER OF DEPUTIES

Rival Factions Clash On Floor Of Chamber

Popular Front Government Sustained By Vote Of Confidence. Minister Cleared Of Charges.

PARIS, Nov. 13—(CP-Havas)—After a tumultuous session during which more than 50 deputies fought, kicked one another and danced on the floor of the House, the Chamber of Deputies today cleared Interior Minister Roger Salengro of charges he was a Great War deserter, and also voted confidence in the Popular Front Government.

When angry spirits had cooled down and Premier Blum had asserted such partisan quarrels hurt France's name abroad, the Chamber voted 427 to 103 to clear Salengro and 374 to 201 expressing confidence in the Government.

Suspends Session

With the Chamber transformed into a maelstrom of struggling, kicking men, Chairman Edouard Herriot suspended the session until attendants and cooler-minded deputies had separated the angry parsons.

The uproar was started with accusations by Rightist Deputy Henri Bergiat, that Salengro was a known anti-militarist before the war and that all witnesses at his courtmartial on desertion charges

ST. HYACINTHE, Nov. 13—Dr. Ronald L. Law, of Kirkfield, Ont., and Dr. John C. Jack of Summerside, P. E. More Bond Borrowing By Campbell Government

\$250,000 Issue Negotiated Through Toronto Firm Will Bring Government's Bond Borrowings Up To Nearly Two Million Dollars.

The Campbell Government has again gone bond-borrowing, this time to the amount of \$250,000 of ten year, 3 per cent bonds. Tenders were not called for publicly, but were invited by telegram from Central Canadian bond houses.

The purpose of the issue is stated to be the redemption of a debenture issue maturing next Spring. Nears Two Million Mark Altogether, the Government has borrowed about two million dollars since taking power in August, 1935.
