THE WEATHER AND THE CROPS.

The recent warm weather, following after the showers has given the Province ideal growing weather and the present prospect is good for splendid crops of hay, grain and root crops.

In Canada at least agriculture is the greatest the most wide-spread, the most productive and important of all our industries.

For that in which one season differs from another, be the spring late or early, whether the summer be wet or dry, whether sunshine and showers shall nourish, or drought or frost shall wither the growing crops, or hail destroy them, is not of man's ordering or control.

Let us hope that the present promise of good crops for this season may be abundantly realized. If so it will mean hope and good cheer in the prospect, and wealth and prosperity in the realization.

PROHIBITION ENFORCEMENT.

We notice that the Grand Jury at Summerside have pointedly referred to the non-enforcement of the Prohibitory Law in certain sections of Prince County, characterising the conditions as disgraceful, and Judge Fitzgerald is reported to have severely criticised the Stipendiary Magistrate and the prosecutor for their failure of duty in the premises.

To the conditions reported in Prince ought to be added for review what has been widely circulated in the press and repeatedly brought to the notice of the Government by the Temperance Alliance in regard to the frequent and flagrant violation of the law in King's County.

It becomes our duty to remind the Government that these conditions in the localities referred to have created a very painful impression upon the public mind.

This feeling is growing and it is damaging to the Government. The sentiment that forced the Prohibitory Law upon the statute book is resolved to maintain it and to make it effective.

It is also strong enough to make and unmake Governments. The friends of the law must and will make common cause to support a law so essential to the welfare of the country and they are resolved to do it.

MOTOR CARS IN NOVA SCOTIA.

The Motor Vehicle Act passed at the last session of the Legislature in Nova Scotia gives important powers to the municipal councils in dealing with the motor cars, regulating their speed and prescribing when and where they may operate.

How important are these powers of regulation is shown by the fact at least so stated in the press, that the municipality of Pictou County have enacted a regulation which allows the use of the roads to the motorist on but one day of the week—Monday—when the farmers' wives are supposed to be engaged in conducting the operations of wash day at their homes.

From Ontario newspapers of various shades of opinion it is apparent that there was considerable difference of opinion with regard to the much controverted three-fifths clause of the local option act.
