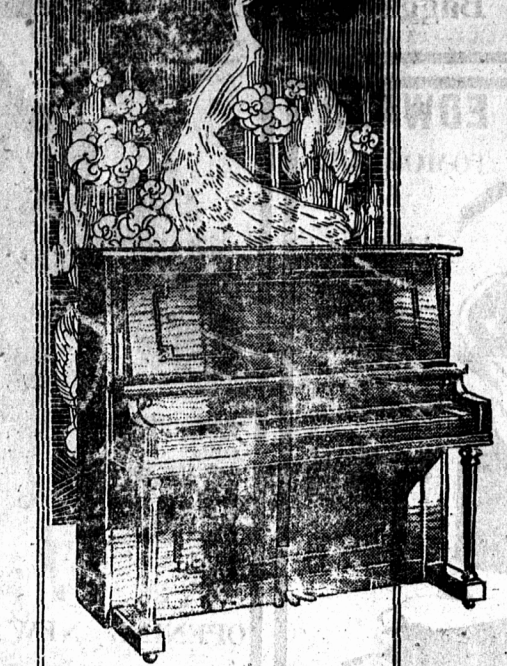

WHITE LEG HORN HOLDS 6 RECORD

SAVANNAH, Ga., Dec. 3.—The "long distance" egg-laying champion of the United States is claimed for Princess Gertrude, a white Leghorn hen that in 385 days laid 339 eggs. Previously, the best record in this country was held by a white Leghorn of the Washington State Agricultural experimental station, 335 eggs in 385 days. The record in New Zealand is 345, and in British Columbia, 357. The latter two are the highest of record in the world, and were made by white Leghorns. Princess Gertrude, owned by C. A. Shepard of Winterville, Ga., won her laurels in an egg laying contest of 51 weeks at the State College of Agriculture at Athens. She laid 335 eggs. Authorities kept her on the job another week to round out the year and lay the additional four eggs that made her the undisputed queen of all American barnyards. Of the 1,000 hens entered in the contest with Princess Gertrude 26 produced more than 300 eggs which is described as a splendid state record.
