Six Deacons Resign After Disagreement On Communion Issue

TORONTO, Jan. 26.—The deacons of Annette Street Baptist Church have resigned in a body as the result of a difference of opinion with their pastor, Rev. W. J. H. Brown, on the question of open versus closed communion. This action of the deacons is the culmination of several months' discussion of the matter, and is directly due to the decision of the pastor to revert to "closed" communion, as provided by the trust deed, instead of continuing "open" communion.

Six Tender Resignation

D. MacLulich is the Vice-Chairman of the resigning board. The other deacons are W. Brack, O. H. Reynolds, W. A. Swaney, W. D. Thomas and C. H. Wormald. "We have had open communion for 18 or 19 years," said Mr. Brack, a deacon for 25 years, who is also a trustee, when speaking to The Globe last night on behalf of himself and colleagues on the Board of Deacons. "We could not continue in office and submit to a change."

"I have always believed in an open table where all believers could meet for the breaking of bread irrespective of their denomination," continued Mr. Brack. "I am taking a conscientious stand on this question, and no one can move me."

Situation is Regretted.

"What will happen now?" asked The Globe. "Will it mean the formation of a new church?"

"We don't know," was the reply. Mr. Brack said the resignations would be accepted at the annual meeting next Thursday. "We have not resigned our membership and are very sorry indeed that the present situation has arisen," said Mr. Brack. "We have a good pastor, and good work is being done in the church, but we felt compelled to tender our resignations."

Mr. Brack admitted that the trust deed provided for closed communion. "But I don't know that until a few nights ago," he added.

Baptism Should Precede.

"About a year ago, through a party of the communion question, I came back to the position that I formerly held," said Rev. W. J. H. Brown. "The teaching of the New Testament is clear that baptism should precede the Lord's Supper. In this position all the great evangelical bodies are agreed. We differ in this: that we recognize immersion as baptism. "If refuse to partake of the Lord's table," he continued. "My duty is simply to teach the Word of God on this subject, then the responsibility rests with the communicants."

Order of Early Church.

Rev. Mr. Brown said that the great historian, Justin Martin, had distinctly stated that this was the order followed in the early Church. Gibbons, in his "Rise and Fall of the Roman Empire," states the same thing; and so does Neander. I believe that the Church should follow the example of the early Church, and carry out the commission of Christ. "We have no right to substitute reason for revelation."

Youth Dies After Brawl at Social

HALIFAX, N. S., Jan. 26.—Clarance O'Brien, 19, of Hants County, died at his home this morning after suffering a broken nose in a fist fight at Upper Kennetcook last week. Hibbert Miller, a neighbor of O'Brien's and the same age, attended a "social" at Upper Kennetcook and during the course of the evening the two youths were engaged in a brawl that had a sudden ending when O'Brien suffered a broken nose. He returned home little the worse for his injury, apparently, but while at work next morning complained of a pain in his head and a short time later became unconscious. He died this morning without recovering consciousness.

Remainder of Tuesday's Evidence At Supreme Court

James Finley, (sworn), I live at Vernon River, live across road from Riverside race track. I remember 17th July last. I was at the dance. I saw the man who wore a peculiar sweater and was told afterwards his name was Peters. It was about 1 o'clock. I saw him dance the dance. I didn't see him dance when I left. I saw the car. I saw nothing unusual about him. I saw no sign of liquor that day.

Cross examined: I was there as a spectator. I had no interest in keeping order. I didn't talk to him.

Edward J. Fraser (sworn)—I live at Vernon. I remember day of the Riverside races. I was there. There was a dance that night. I was at it. I noticed Peters there. There were two, I saw with him. I didn't notice his condition in the afternoon. In the evening he was perfectly sober as far as I know. He was dancing. I didn't notice any person he was dancing with. I stayed until the dance was finished—about a quarter of 11 as far as I know, I didn't notice them leave. I saw no sign of liquor that day. Nobody drunk or half drunk there. I went around to a brawl that had a sudden ending when O'Brien suffered a broken nose. I took particular notice. It was a part of my business.

Cross examined: It is, from the track to town, about 17 miles. My son owns the track. I wouldn't say there was no one without a drink. I was not talking to Peters. I was looking for bootleggers. He was perfectly normal.

Miss Edna Fraser (sworn) I live at Vernon. I am a daughter of the last witness. I remember the dance of 17th July last. I was there. I danced. Mr. Peters was there, dancing. It was the laucers. I was swinging with Dennis Peters during the dance. I would say he was perfectly alright. I mean he wasn't drinking. If there was any I could smell it. The dance broke up between 10:30 and 11. There was a car on the grounds when I left. I didn't notice McCoubrey. He (Peters) had on a peculiar sweater. (One produced in court) a funny colored one like that.

Mrs. James Finley (sworn). I am the wife of Mr. James Finley. I live opposite the park at Riverside. There was a dance on 17th July last. I was there in the evening for a while. I noticed a man in an odd colored sweater. I saw him dancing. I didn't see his face. I remarked he was a clever looking dancer. I saw nobody under the influence of liquor that day.

Miss Mary Henry (sworn)—I live at Vernon River. I was at the dance I noticed the man with the peculiar sweater. I saw him dancing. I thought he was sober. I didn't see the car. I left before the dance was over. I saw no signs of liquor that day.

Wilfred Praught (sworn)—I live at Cherry Valley. I was at the races that day. I was at the dance that evening. I stayed until the dancing was over. I noticed Mr. Peters there. He was dancing when I noticed him. He could see, he seemed to be quite nifty on his feet dancing. I saw no sign of liquor there that day or anybody under its influence. The dance broke up around 11. He was dancing I think at the last dance.

Cross-examined: He seemed to dance quite steadily. All the time that I go is that he didn't show liquor.

Mrs. Pearl White (sworn) I live on Richmond St. in Charlottetown. I am a married woman, my husband's name is John White. I know Dennis Peters, McCoubrey, James Roberts and George Roberts. James didn't know Albert Youland.

I remember the 17th July last. That evening I was home all evening. My husband was home up in the stairs. I was down in the dining room. There are two doors in the dining room at the rear. There is a gangway towards Pownall St. there is one on the other side also. Louis McCoubrey wasn't in my place all day Saturday. I am sure Louis McCoubrey wasn't in my place all day Saturday. He got no can nor any liquor. George Roberts came over about 7:30. I was talking to him. He came by the back door through the gangway nearer Queen Street.

He got no liquor or can. He asked if I wanted to go to the Riverside side dance. I said I didn't want to go. I know Miss Youland to see her. I knew the car had gone over the wharf. I knew there was an inquest and preliminary investigation before the Magistrate. I saw Miss Youland before this on Richmond St. talking to James Roberts.

I didn't hear what she said to him. I heard what he said in reply. I heard Martha Youland tell James Roberts he wasn't any good and that he would rather save McCoubrey than Peters. He said his own brother's name. I heard nothing further stated to me. I was loud enough for me to hear it. Martha Youland was crying. I was on the opposite side of the street. She was crying loud enough for all the neighbors to hear. She seemed to be quite angry with James Roberts. The Cahills were out.

Cross examined: I am a relation to any of the prisoners. I am connected with the Riverside side dance. Mrs. Crawford's house is right opposite McCoubrey came there quite often. He used to play auction for a time in the evenings. My husband sold liquor then. My husband is a laborer.

Mrs. Louisa Crawford (sworn) I live at 100 Richmond St., between Queen and Pownall St. I know where Mrs. Pearl White lives. It is a next door toward Pownall Street.

I remember the accident at South point. I remember the Saturday night before that. Was a dance between 7 and 8 by George Roberts to go to the dance at Riverside. He told me Miss Youland was going. I know Martha Youland to see her. I know Jas. Roberts. I saw Miss Youland and Jas. Roberts talking. They both seemed to be angry. She seemed to be very angry. I didn't hear what she said.

Cross-examined: I am a widow. I am taking care of my son. I am not a friend of any of the prisoners. I live in Charlottetown. I keep the Royal Hotel. I know Dennis Peters, Louis McCoubrey, Jas. Roberts, George Roberts, Albert Youland, and Martha Youland. I remember the 17th July last. Jas. Roberts, George Roberts and Louis McCoubrey had tea at supper at my house that night. I saw them at tea about 7:15. Jas. and George Roberts were boarders with me at that time. McCoubrey was not there. He paid me for his supper. They were all sober as far as I know. Miss Clara Austin works with me. She was serving the supper. They left my house to go to the dance at Riverside. I didn't see Jas. Roberts. I didn't take notice if they had anything or not. I didn't see any signs of liquor. Clara Austin and I left before 8. Dennis Peters wasn't there nor Albert Youland.

Leo Praught (sworn) I live in Cherry Valley. Am a butcher and the Youland. The Georgetown road passes my house. (Here Mr. Praught tells two routes that could be taken to go to the dance at Riverside. I remember the night of 17th July last. I was awakened by a George Roberts were boarders with me at that time. McCoubrey was not there. He paid me for his supper. They were all sober as far as I know. I told one fellow if he followed the heavy telephone line he would get there. He thought if he got to Pownall he would be alright. The man who rapped was quite sober. I was quite bright. There were two men standing by the post with her. I couldn't go; it was Saturday night. Peters was there in the hall sitting on the stairs. George Roberts had a can, he went through to the kitchen. I heard him filling the car with water as far as I could tell. He came through the hall again. I thought it was a can of water. He put it in the back of the car. Louis McCoubrey didn't go upstairs nor come down with a can as far as I know. I saw neither take any empty bottles out from house to car. Peters was only in the hall. He was perfectly sober as far as I could see. I saw no sign of liquor. (Cross-examined) I keep a board.

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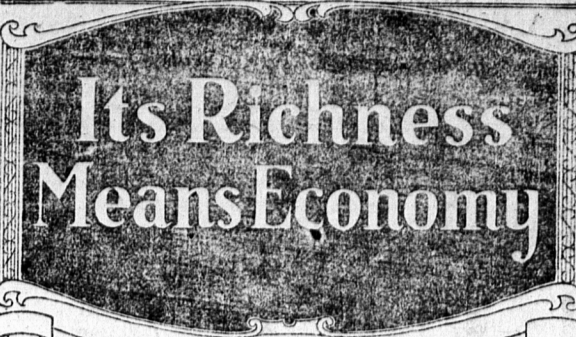
