MONTREAL, June 30.—The foreign demand for Canadian grain was steady. Prices for potatoes ruled steady with a small trade passing. New Brunswick Green Mountain white were offered at \$1.70 to \$1.80 per bag of 90 pounds net. A moderate amount of feeling was firm. Fresh extras were quoted at 37 cents to 38 cents per dozen. The receipts were 2,822 cases. Owing to the continued liberal supplies coming forward and the small demand, an easier feeling again prevailed in the butter market and prices declined. Another 1-cent per pound. Number 1 pasteurized was offered at 34 cents to 34 1/4 cents per pound. The receipts were 2,825 packages. Extreme dullness marked the cheese trade but prices were steady to a shade stronger. Sales of flour continued active, but prices were unchanged. A fair trade was transacted with United States.
