GREAT CELEBRATION HELD AT LEIPSI

LEIPSI, Saxony, Oct. 17.—Never before in her history has the Saxon capital entertained such a large gathering of notables as is now assembled here for the celebration of the one hundredth anniversary of the battle of Leipsic. Emperor William heads the list of visitors, which also includes the rulers of practically all of the states of the empire. The Emperor of Austria, the Emperor of Russia and the King of Sweden have sent personal representatives to take part in the festivities. In the crowds that throng the streets and fill the cafes and other public places are to be seen officers wearing the uniform distinctive of the armies of a dozen of the European nations.

Today, aided by a programme of oratory, pageantry and military display, the people of a united Germany looked backward one hundred years and bowed low to the warriors who won "the battle of the nations," the fight which broke the power of Napoleon and marked the culmination of the German war of liberation. Tomorrow the celebration will reach a climax in the dedication of the \$10,000,000 monument erected by the people of Germany in commemoration of their victory.

The battle of Leipsic, known throughout the world as "the Battle of the Nations," emphatically deserved that name, for it was a desperate struggle of the German nations and their allies against Napoleon's army composed of Frenchmen and soldiers of the few countries which still adhered to his tottering fortunes. On the side of the Germans dark, rough stone, hewn in huge rills, Russians and Swedes and even a detachment of British troops a rocket brigade, in all about 300,000 men, while more than 200,000 men fought on the French side. More than 3000 cannon were employed during the four days of the battle, which has gone down in history as the biggest and bloodiest battle since the remote days of Xerxes.

The battle of Leipsic was the culmination of the struggle of the German countries to free themselves from the Napoleonic yoke. Napoleon has suffered tremendous losses during 1812, but with a last effort he had organized a new army of nearly 500,000 men, with which he invaded Germany in the following year. The Germans, realising that the critical moment had arrived which would decide the future and would either free them for ever from the French yoke or perpetuate Napoleon's rule over them, staked everything upon the outcome of the great battle fought back and forth, undecided, but with slight advantage to the allies. On the fourth day Napoleon realised that he was fast losing ground, and

ordered a retreat under cover of the rear guard which continued the fight to prevent the main body of the French army from being blocked. When the French army retreated eighty thousand dead and wounded were left upon the battlefield which included Leipsic and its suburbs.

Napoleon's defeat at Leipsic compelled him to return to France. The allies undertook to intercept him, but he brushed them aside at Harsau, on October 30, and finally succeeded in placing the Rhine between himself and his pursuers. At Leipsic Napoleon had received a blow from which he never recovered. He had used by the last of the great armies immediately available to him, and his subsequent struggles were against odds that rendered his success impossible.

Germany celebrated the fiftieth anniversary of the battle of Leipsic in 1863. Today it is an infinitely greater Germany than it was in 1863, united, strong and powerful and enjoying peace and prosperity.

The monument which has been erected to commemorate the great battle and what it stands for, occupies the top of an artificial elevation. It had to be made because nowhere in the vicinity of Leipsic is there anything that would deserve the name of a hill. Like most of the German national monuments the Leipsic monument is an imposing, almost overwhelming structure, built all of dark, rough stone, hewn in huge blocks and cyclopean in its forbidding massiveness. Terraces mount to it and its base shows the curved figure of St. Michael in gigantic proportions. To the right and the left the figure of the stone is carved to represent a battlefield strewn with dead, while down upon it looks the divinites of war. Then rises the huge trunk of the monument. Beneath the top, a square block of stone, a ring of colossal figures encircles it, which represent the union and strength of the German states forming the federation. The entire monument is mirrored in the waters of a pond extending along the front of the monument and trees from the background of the massive structure.

Fruits and food products are carried across oceans and reach their destination in perfect condition; poultry, fish, game and meats are stored during the season of the year when at their best and kept for months and even years, which otherwise could be had during a few weeks only. Our theaters and public dining rooms are cooled even to a degree of discomfort in the hottest weather; towns of moderate size, in places where water never freezes out of doors, now have their dependable daily supply of ice, with the regularity of sunrise and at a price no higher than that charged for natural ice in long-winter lands. In modern offices ice water flows from a pipe in every room of tallest skyscrapers, while far below the beds of rivers engineers bore great tunnels through treacherous quicksands, made safe and solid by artificial freezing.

This great engine of beneficence and utility is not in the public eye and mind like the telephone and the electric light, but its loss to the world under present-day conditions of city
