It'd Be "Heil Schicklgruber!" If Fuehrer's Father Hadn't Changed Family Name to Hitler

BY MILTON BRONNER European Manager of NEA Service "Heil Schicklgruber!" would be almost too big a mouthful even for the most ardent Nazi.

With his speaking ability, his vehemence, his energy, he made himself propagandist leader of the party, the key post. The Party began to grow in Munich, in Bavaria. It attracted the interest and financial and organizational help of Hitler's superiors who saw in the instrument with which to crush the Social Democrat regime. Hitler became the darling of the local aristocrats whom he so envied. Enemies of the regime poured in funds, from within Germany and from abroad.

By November, 1923, Bavarian reactionaries and Baden Army leaders were getting ready for an insurrection similar to Franco's revolt in Spain. Hitler began to worry that he would be squeezed out by his superiors. He put an insidious end to the famous "beer-cellar" putsch of Munich. Sixteen Nazis died. Ludendorff, Hitler's co-conspirator, was honorably arrested. Goebbels was wounded—but Hitler flopped on the ground when the soldiers fired and suffered nothing more than a wrenched arm.

In 1924, he was tried for this putsch, imprisoned for five years, freed after six months. He spent the time dictating part of his ego-centric, blood-curdling "Mein Kampf".

Thereafter Hitler worked within the law. No more putsches. Now he concentrated on electing Nazi deputies to the Reichstag but despised so much. His representation tremulously. But in the 1932 elections, the Nazis suffered a severe loss. It looked as if Hitler was through, for Hindenburg had beaten him for the Presidency, too.

HOLMAN'S CHARLOTTETOWN SUMMERSIDE

With the exchange closed two days next week, Tuesday for the elections and Friday for Armistice Day, boardroom customers apparently decided to keep decks reasonably clear in order to be prepared for eventualities.

The day's business news was moderately cheering and holders of pivotal stocks continued to display reluctance to sell.

The two-hour proceedings were the most apathetic in nearly two months. Transfers of 434,410 shares compared with 613,990 last Saturday. The six-day volume was less than half that of the week before. The Associated Press av-

erage of 60 issues was up 1 of a point at 52.5 today and this was exactly the net gain for the week. In the closing session, modest improvement was retained by Anaconda, Kennecott, American Smelting, U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, Chrysler, American Telephone, Westinghouse, Douglas Aircraft, U. S. rubber preferred and Du Pont.

Among the Canadian issues, fractional gains were shown by Canadian Pacific, Distillers and Lake Shore. Hiram Walker was down a fraction. Canada 4s were in small supply.

MONTREAL, Nov. 6 —(CP)—Buying sentiment was a little better in Saturday's stock market, but advances still were small.

Metals rallied after early session and Noranda pushed up another 1-8 point to 80 3-8, new high for a year or more. Smelters tacked on 1-4 but Nickel slipped in late selling to 56 1-2, off 1-4. Hudson Bay and Hollinger held steady.

Rail equipments ran up slightly on light buying with small improvements for National Steel Car at 69 and Canadian Car preferred at 31. Dominion Steel B backed 1-4 to 11 1/4.
