THE Rev. R. O'Leary, received a letter from the Rev. Edward Bell of Souris, on Monday. Rev. E. and Mrs. Bell are touring in England. They speak glowingly of the grandeur of English scenery and the magnificence of the weather prevailing there. Mr. and Mrs. Bell are enjoying themselves intensely. They expect to leave England for Canada on the 9th of June. Mr. Bell says all steamers full until then. There is a strong tide of emigration toward Canada, and the western world generally.

EASTERN NOTES.—The first of May is here. A few wheels, cases of necessity, are travelling the roads, climbing snowbanks, winding in and out of fields, and bounding over fences.—Ice still holds firm on North Lake and Black Pond, the latest date for a good many years. Some loose cakes are drifting about in the Gulf but they don't amount to much. Herring nets have been set along the south side for the last week, but the catches so far have been disappointing. A few trawls are set, and a trial baiting resulted in a fine catch of eels. The last two years we had cod-fish this time, but they were the earliest for a good many years back. The cod, like nearly all our fish, come into the Gulf every spring by way of Cape North and the condition, the presence or absence of the ice at that point, determines the period of their arrival on our shores. The great body of them strike north of East Point, and are found during summer along our whole North Shore. A very good share of them strike south of the Point, and if there is a north east breeze during the time of their migration the share is larger; for these fishermen of West River Red Point and Little Harbor are now waiting, and they generally catch a share of them. Further west the catches of cod don't amount to much as the school appears to keep more to sea outside of the numerous headlands.—A few Nova Scotia travellers are back and forth probably in quest of bit.—The lobster men are on the ground but few traps set on account of ice. The Red Point Packing Co. are in the business again with no change in the members of the firm.—Machine agents are beginning another season's work, and manifesting by their presence that they have survived the snows and cold of winter.—Great Eastern Lodge I O G T have shifted their night of meeting to Saturday to accommodate the hardy fishermen belonging to their Order.
