Contract Bridge

Choice of Bids
The bidding in today's deal brings out a point that is too often overlooked by the average player.

North dealer.
Both sides vulnerable.

This deal occurred in a total point team-of-four match, the outcome of which reflected the bidding of both teams on this particular board.

At Table 1 this was the auction:

North	East	South	West
Pass	Pass	1♥	1♠
Pass	Pass	3♥	Pass
4♥	Pass	Pass	Pass

West opened the king and ace of clubs, and by playing carefully South made two overtricks, for a total score of 680 points.

At the other table the North player was more imaginative. Here the bidding proceeded:

North	East	South	West
Pass	Pass	1♠	1♠
Pass	Pass	3♠	Pass
4♠	Pass	Pass	Pass

Attention is called to the vastly different effects of the four-heart bid at Table 1 and North's three-spade bid of Table 2. In the first case South could not even think about going further, because, for all he could tell, his partner had staked mightily even to bid the game. In the second case, North gave invaluable information with his cue bid of the opponents' suit—and without risking anything in the process! North had passed originally, and had not been able to raise South's opening bid on the first round; thus, there was no chance that the three-spade cue bid could make South too enthusiastic, because the best he could expect from North was an ace and the queen of his own heart suit—which was precisely what North would lay down.

One word about the play. The declarer had to exercise care in the diamond suit. After drawing only two rounds of trumps they both employed the proper technique of cashing three rounds of diamonds and ruffing the last diamond.

WINNIPEG MAN CANADA'S TOP BASEBALL FAN

WINNIPEG, Sept. 16 (CP)—Canada's No. 1 World Series fan is Jack McConnell of Winnipeg whose trip this year to see the baseball battle will be his 27th consecutive trek.

Up until this spring, Mr. McConnell ran second for the honor, with Joe Page of Montreal holding the edge, having attended every series since 1897. But the death of the latter left an open field for Mr. McConnell.

Naturally enough, attendance at the various games has gained for him an impressive array of baseball souvenirs—which he wouldn't part with for a spot on the all-star line-up. Among these relics are 21 baseballs autographed by notables as prominent as Babe Ruth and Lefty Gomez as well as pennants that are his pride and joy.

Mr. McConnell tells of the day he met Joe E. Brown at a game and asked the celebrity for his autograph. Joe had a drink in one hand and a hot dog in the other but he signed the autograph without hindrance by stuffing the whole dog in his mouth and tossing off the drink at a gulp as well.

Sports writing isn't exactly in Mr. McConnell's line, but he has covered the big games for a Winnipeg paper more than once. That has enabled him to meet many famous people. Among them are Eddie Cantor, Gail Patrick, the late Will Rogers, Al Jolson and Helen Hayes.

He's busy at the moment planning his trip for this year. "I'm rooting for the Cardinals," says McConnell. "I still think they will come through."

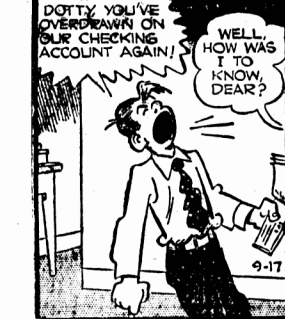

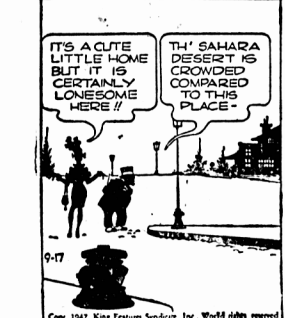

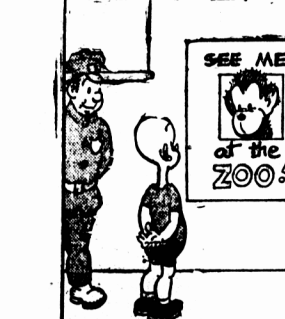
