MORAL AND SOCIAL REFORM.

Moralists and reformers, the world throughout, are encouraged by evident signs of the awakening of the people to need for reform along many lines in social, in political, and in other affairs. They are beginning to lay the flattering unction to their souls that these manifestations of public interest are indications of the desire of man to strive for the fulfillment of ideals which will make the world better and purer.

In all sincerity, we may say that such a prospect is alluring. That sympathy and assistance will be generously given to those engaged in the active work of reform goes without saying. There will be some obstruction, of course, from a class of people whose position is entrenched by a course of procedure that has organized them into a distinct force, a force that will have to be overcome and banished by the army of reformers.

This matter was brought close to this City the other evening by the formation of a league of citizens pledged to social and moral reform. Judging from the attendance at this meeting, the proceedings of which have been already reported by The Guardian, the outlook for the accomplishment of good is hopeful.

There is need for such a society. While this community is not in a condition to make the necessity in any way an exceptionally marked one; yet it is plain that the thin end of the wedge of corruption, and organized wrong-doing in other besides political matters, will have to be prevented from widening the operations of the enemies of morality, who might be disposed to practice in our midst.

There was not much said at the meeting—although there were there many representative citizens, well used to public speaking. There was more of a disposition to get to work—to do something—rather than a desire at that time to talk over the intricate and delicate, or indelicate phases of politics, or to define the responsibility of evil, or whether the same rested with the voter, the politician, or the candidate.

We allude to politics because that subject was mentioned at the meeting. But as the newly-elected President of the League said, there were other matters which would come within the powers of the League. Forms of amusement by which the young are familiarized with evil and taught impurity, etc., should and would engage attention. The movement for the formation of this society was started by the clergy of this City. Similar societies or leagues have been established throughout the Dominion; and with an organization uniting the different branches in all the cities there should be much good accomplished. The aims of the league will be heartily supported by all men who love

Canada, and desire to see their country occupy a high position among the nations of the earth.
