Sow the Seed as early in the Spring as possible, roll the ground perfectly level; the grass should be cut often, and never allowed to attain a length of over three inches.

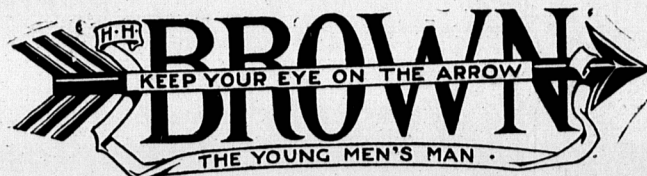

### TRAIN MEN FOR LONDON POLICE

LONDON, April 26—London's police men are admired and envied by all nations. From Germany, France and even India policemen and officials have been sent to find out how the city policemen manage London's great crowds so skillfully, says the London Morning Leader.

The men are the pick of the country, for some hundreds aspire to be in the famous force for every ten who can be taken on.  
Men desirous of joining must present themselves at the chief offices in Old Jewry where an inspector glances over the applicants, dismisses those who obviously do not come up to the required physical standard and arranges for likely men to come up for examination of character, eye testing and measuring.

When the aspirant has passed these tests he is handed over to Dr. Gordon Browne, the medical chief of the police and their hospital, for examination.

The lucky few who have survived the sifting so far are drafted into school at Snowhill, where they are trained for a couple of months in every conceivable duty. Classes are held in common law, writing and reports, marching and saluting, while from time to time the men are sent into the gallery of the Central Criminal Court, to watch and study the methods of the courts and the ways of giving evidence.

The geography of the city must be as an open book to the policemen, and the young men are sent to walk around the domains they will have to help guard, and note the boundaries of the city.

### TOWNS BURNED AWFUL HAVOC

BEIRUT, April 26—The town of Hadjin, 100 miles north of Alexandretta, where regiments of Turkish soldiers have withstood the assaults of the fanatics for the past week was in flames yesterday. At this place there are five American women missionaries.

Latakia, in Syria, has been neglected—thanks to the operations of the French cruiser "Jules Ferry." Thousands of refugees have been pouring into Latakia, and the presence of the French warship will have much influence in controlling the situation. The refugees are mostly women and children, many of the members of their families having been killed.

CONSTANTINOPLE, April 26—The deposition of Sultan Abdul Hamid appears certain, and the guns saluting Mehmed Rehad Effendi as the new ruler of the Empire will probably be heard before Friday.

ALEXANDRETTA, Asiatic Turkey, April 26—The refugees who made their escape from Deiriyul, not far from Alexandretta, bring most alarming accounts of the situation there, 10,000 Armenians are beleaguered by 50,000 Moslems. The besieged are half-starved and the conditions within the City are pitiful.

### SQUALL CLEARED CANADIAN CHANNEL

YOUNGSTOWN, N. Y., April 26—A northwest squall followed by an even more energetic southwest gale, cleared the Canadian channel at the mouth of the Niagara River this afternoon, broadened the passage torn out by dynamite, along the American shore of the stream and so ripped easy a way the lower end of the ice pack, that it is now possible to cross the river in a boat by a straight course from the fort to Niagara-on-the-Lake. The engineers did not work today.

It is the general feeling of old residents here that the tons of ice still anchored to the river's bank will now slip down stream without further damage.

### RAILWAY MEN TO HAVE BIG GATHERING

MONCTON, N. B., April 26—There were but three deaths in the ranks of the I. C. R. Employees' Relief and Insurance Association for the month ending April 25th, according to the report of Secretary W. C. Paver. H. H. Haines and Damon Pellerin, both of Moncton, and Maguire Levesque, of River Loup, the latter who met accidental death; all had \$250 insurance. Thomas Wilson, of Halifax, drew the same amount for total disability. In addition to these W. T. Bulmer, a member of the temporary employees' accident fund, died as the result of injuries received while on duty. Fees and levies for the month are: Class A., \$1.30; Class B., 90c.; Class C., 70c. It is expected that the Maritime Provinces will be well represented at the thirty-second biennial gathering of Railway Conductors of America, which opens at Boston May 17th. The ladies' auxiliary of the order will also hold a gathering, and it is expected that over six thousand members of the order with their wives and friends will be present. Twenty delegates will go from Moncton, and others from all points of the Intercolonial. Delegates from Canada, the United States and Mexico will be present.
