CANNED CORN

It is hard to wait for all the wealth of Summer vegetables that will soon begin to come to us...

Corn a la Southern

Take two cups canned corn or corn which has been boiled and cut from the cob, two eggs, two table-spoons melted butter, two table-spoons sugar, one teaspoon salt, pepper and two cups hot milk...

Corn Fritters

Take one cup canned corn, one cup flour, one teaspoon baking powder, one and one-half teaspoons salt, one-quarter teaspoon paprika, speck of cayenne, two eggs. Chop the corn, add flour sifted with baking powder and seasonings...

Corn Oysters

To one cup cooked corn, add one well-beaten egg and one-quarter cup flour and season well with salt and pepper. Drop by spoonfuls on a hot, well-greased griddle...

Succotash

Cut hot boiled corn from the cob; add an equal quantity of hot, boiled shelled beans. Season with butter and salt. Reheat before serving.
