### THE EDITOR'S MAIL.

#### PROHIBITION AND THE SCOTT ACT.

SIR,—In your issue of Monday you criticise from a friendly standpoint the action of the Alliance in recommending the Prohibition Act to take the place of the Scott Act in our several counties. Such criticism is certainly welcome as it brings before the temperance people in the Island the arguments for and against this procedure. We cannot expect Christian temperance workers to go to all the trouble involved in such a substitution unless some real decided advantage is to be gained. As one of those who were in favor of this recommendation allow me to bring before your readers some of the reasons that influence the Alliance to such action. First, then, no one took a stronger stand than the Prohibition Act was superior to the Scott Act in its general provisions. In many points they coincide, but the Alliance was almost not entirely in agreement in believing that we have better facilities to amend and perfect our Island Act than we have the Scott Act. Some few pleaded for delay until by its practical working in Charlottetown its defects would be shown and amendments needed obtained. But surely these amendments could be more quickly obtained when the whole Island is under the act than they could be by Charlotte only alone.

But I think I am not wrong in saying that the chief objection to that we find with the Alliance was this: that the Government of our Island has a vital connection with the Prohibition Act. It became law by their Legislature. The Scott Act, however, was the wish of the people in a County or municipality. Hence government in every province of our Dominion have thrown the entire burden of its enforcement upon private citizens and do not hesitate to share a home upon a community the entire disgrace of repeated and continued violations. Temperance workers more than ever feel that the Government which legislates should be the executive of its own law. Under prohibition they can rather their forces together so that they can bring to bear our Government the pressure arising from votes as well as moral arguments and not the blame of non-enforcement on the Government. Some of us—many of us—never expect to see much improvement until we see a better order of things. We want a Government that is earnest, even, enthusiastic for prohibition, the child of their own creation. We have many of our members on both sides of politics and each man and woman that when they act comes in for a thorough-out whole provides they will rise to the occasion. It is easier to combine and force on a Government than it is to induce private citizens to become private detectives. Force the Government to appoint its prosecutor, let them pay him a good salary and when he finds out his position depends on the success of his suits then prohibition will be made his name. This, too, through a Government, is the only way in which we can have steady and persistent effort against the traffic. When the chief burden is thrown upon private citizens the efforts put forth are certain to be spasmodic. What other law or other statutes is enforced as the Scott Act? None. We want to be able to tell our Government this is your Act. A determined people will soon see a determined Government, and a determined Government will have determined officers and in a few years this evil will be greatly limited.
