DESTITUTION IN CHARLOTTETOWN.—Some people may hardly credit the fact that there is at the present time a considerable number of actual cases of destitution in this town. The following may be cited as a particular case.—A young man who enlisted early in 1917 and served with the garrison in Halifax and who was not considered fit for overseas service was discharged in June, 1919. Since that time he has had casual employment throughout the Maritime Provinces. While working in the New Brunswick lumber woods he was injured and returned to Charlottetown about the first of the year. Since his return he has been unable to obtain any work whatever and being without any relatives or home has been compelled to live in vacant barns. He has been a perfectly sober young man and is reduced to the state where in fact he was altogether minus underclothes and without even a shirt coat and for two days was without anything to eat. Since his sad condition was brought to the attention of the authorities a few days ago he has been supplied with these necessities and has received aid from the Federal Appropriation Fund, but is still without work. Considering that this young man offered for overseas service and did all he could on behalf of his country and has been reduced through untoward circumstances to such a state of poverty it surely is sad indeed to think that such a man should be thus reduced. It is to be hoped the citizens will awake to the present situation and do all in their power to offer such men employment.
