MR. JAMES LEIGHTIZER'S ADDRESS ON THE POULTRY INDUSTRY GIVEN BEFORE ROTARY CLUB

Following is the address delivered by Roatlian James Leightizer at the weekly luncheon of the Club on Monday.

The problem of developing our egg and poultry industry in the matter of increasing production and the necessity for doing so is of more importance than a casual glance would reveal.

It is not my intention to deal, or attempt to deal, with the many and varied phases of this industry, nor attempt with the short time at my disposal to give more than a few vital facts in connection with the industry on this island and throughout Canada.

Special attention will be given to increased production, as an increase along this line affects the prosperity of our province and the prosperity of our citizens, both rural and urban.

Those who are interested in the promotion of poultry and the products thereof are almost unanimous in the opinion of the Canadian poultryman that a large and very productive field to cultivate, and what applies to Canada, certainly applies very directly to the poultry producers of Prince Edward Island.

Before dealing with local affairs let us briefly consider what has been done in Canada in the way of increased production of eggs during the period from 1920 to 1925.

The large increase in the consumption of eggs in Canada, as shown by Government reports, has been from a per capita consumption of 16 dozen and eggs in 1920 to 26 dozen and 8 eggs in 1925; this is truly a very remarkable showing. It clearly demonstrates the confidence and appreciation of the buying public in the egg in Canada; and whilst these regulations may leave much to be desired; still they are the best and most practical regulations in effect in any country in the world.

This is the only province of Canada which does not import eggs, our eggs stand second to none in the principal markets of Canada, the demand exceeds our present ability to supply.

At this time I will interpose a few facts concerning some outstanding examples of what is being done by some members of the Prince Edward Island Egg Poultry Association, the company which I represent.

During the past year one member sent in 1589 dozen, receiving an average price of 38.69c a dozen; another sent in 3034 dozen; another making a net profit of \$2.50 per hen; and so on, but remember gentlemen these things did not "just happen". As the ad of a well known firm says, "there's a reason" and it is careful management and attention to details, and in this respect the poultry industry is no different than any other.

The visiting delegates from the World's Poultry Congress held at Ottawa during the past summer, were lavish in their praise of our island. Mr. S. H. Lewer, President of the "Feathered World", London, England, said: "The Island is the best piece of farming district I have seen in Canada".

Where does all this lead to? Just this, our people must take greater effort; our boys and girls on the farms must be given a better training in the science of agriculture, and a special attention must be paid to the poultry branch. With increased population more advantages may be taken of the golden opportunities right at hand.

When our production of poultry products increases export, we are right at the "front door" of Canada, with Halifax and St. John, now National ports, ready to handle the freight we may send.

Then if the most desirable types of Colonists are available, let Prince Edward Island, "the Cradle of Confederation" the demonstration of Co-operative Marketing to the rest of Canada, the smallest and best province of this great Dominion, share in the immigration increasing demand in policy now being taken advantage of by our sister provinces.
