A carload of geese attracted considerable attention at the I. C. R. station last evening, there being upwards of a thousand in the lot, going through from P. E. Island to Boston to a buyer, who has a large farm where they would be finished for the Boston market. Shipments of this kind naturally suggest the possibilities of trade under reciprocity. According to the tariff schedule, the present duty is three cents a pound on live geese. Take the average weight at ten pounds, at the lowest many would weigh more—and that means a tariff barrier of thirty cents each. Remove this trade restriction, and there would be on a lot of one thousand the tidy sum of \$300 in the hands of Island farmers. If the geese were killed the duty would be five cents a pound. There is a concrete case, showing just what the adoption of this trade agreement means to producers in the Maritime Provinces.—Moncton Ex.

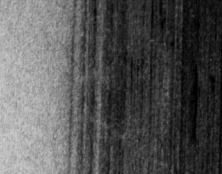
