SHIP THAT TOOK SHORE LEAVE

About 12 years ago an English steamer which ran between Latin America and England was picked up by a tidal wave and washed far inland on the coast of central America. There it was deposited upright in good condition, but stranded over a mile from the water.

The owners collected their insurance and Lloyds proceeded to advertise the hull for sale. Some Central Americans took the boat at a low figure and used the engines as a power station, working the ship for nine years in this way with considerable profit.

When the war came and boats rose in value to unheard of figures, a number of Americans bought an option on the boat and gambled in getting it back to the ocean. Using the ship's own power, they dug a channel ahead of the boat and finally got it afloat. A little caulking and a crew enabled the vessel to reach San Francisco, where it was held up for a while pending an investigation of its papers, long since out of registry.

When the Americans had rehabilitated the ship, they were offered \$1,500,000 for it, but declined that sum to take a higher figure. Such was the value of the ship which enjoyed shore leave for nine years.—Wall Street Journal.

There is food enough in Russia, but the fault lies in its distribution, and this fault may be traced, first to the long war, and the disorganization that occurred in consequence, to the mismanagement of the old regime, to the confusion arising with the revolution, and to the mismanagement of the revolutionary government. Transportation has diminished in efficiency, the provinces in the north raise but little grain, and it is difficult to take hauls from the south and east it is difficult to transport enough food.
