IN MEMORIAM

GEORGE ORIN BURNS

There passed away at Bloomfield, Ont., on January 31st, George Orin Burns, beloved eldest son of Mrs. Burns and the late James Burns of Missisquoi. Born at Malouin Sept. 1, 1896 he spent his childhood there and was familiarly known as "Buz". He was educated at Fanning School where he showed marked ability and later in life attended Agricultural College at Truro, N.S.

Shortly after the outbreak of the war he enlisted with the 8th C.M.F. and is well known to those of the 10th battalion with which he was later identified. During the Ypres salient in May 1916 he was struck by bursting shrapnel and suffered severe wounds in shoulder and thigh. Wounds continued to trouble him thro' the years and on two occasions he was operated on for removal of shrapnel splinters. In the battle in which he received his injuries, they were ordered to unburden themselves from all accoutrements except ammunition. In his pack which he subsequently discarded was a little bible. Twenty seven years passed before he again saw that little book. His two close friends, Jack and Alan Brown, brothers, who sailed from Halifax were both killed. In the cleaning up following the battle, the names "Brown" and "Burns" were evidently confused and some of the contents of George Burns' knapsack including the bible, was sent to the sister of the Browns at Dartmouth, N.S. This sister became acquainted with a lady from Malouin who recognized the name on the bible was given it to return to the owner. In March 1943 George Burns and his wife, Mrs. Helen Burns, returned to Malouin, N.S. much to his surprise and delight was given the little blood-stained book.

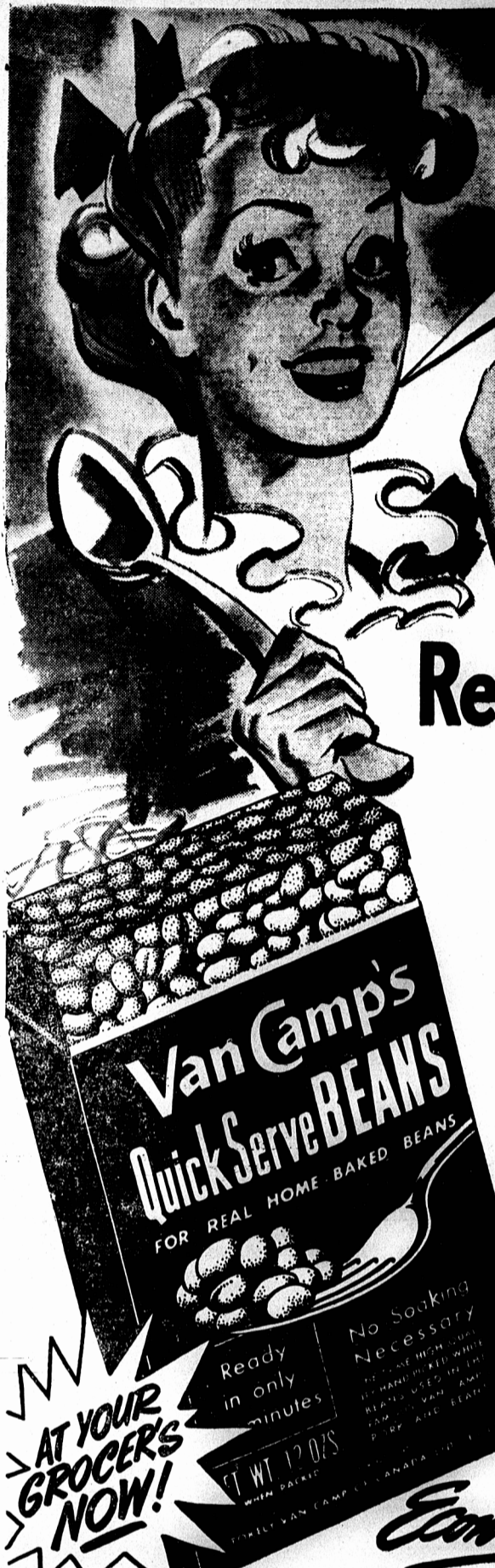
