MCKINLEY AND ROOSEVELT

Republican's Elected Yesterday President and Vice President

CARRIED ALL THE STATES CARRIED IN 1896

New York State Goes Republican by 125,000 - Ohio 160,000 - Bryan has the Solid South - Boston Democratic by 5,000 - Sweeping Republican Victory Claimed - Bryan Awaits Fuller Returns Before He Will Speak.

NEW YORK, Midnight, Nov. 6.-(Special.)-McKinley is undoubtedly elected. The Republicans claim New York, by 125,000, and Chairman Jones of the Democratic National Committee concedes that the Republicans have carried that state while the official figures coming in declare the Republican victory in the vicinity of one hundred thousand. Apparently McKinley has again carried all the states that went for him in 1896, some of them, however, by a reduced majority. The Republicans have about one hundred thousand majority in Illinois and forty thousand in New Jersey. The Democrats carried Boston by about 5,000. Republicans claim 130,000 plurality in Ohio. The Democrats carry North Carolina, Arkansas, Virginia, Texas by 100,000. At 11 o'clock the Republicans claim McKinley's election by a larger vote than four ago. Bryan declines to make any statement until the results are all known and some Democrats have hopes that other states will make up the lost ground, but all indications are that McKinley has won a sweeping victory. Returns are coming in very slowly and very incomplete.

SERIOUS ACCIDENTS

COLORED MAN KILLED

Free Fight in Delaware Between White and Colored Voters.

ELECTION RIOT—OFFICER KILLED.

DENVER, Nov. 6.-(Special.)-During an election riot here this morning John G. Brantford, colored special officer, was killed and five other officers more or less injured.

One or two of the latter will die. ELECTION ROWS AND ILLEGAL VOTING.

At Philadelphia, William Martin, Democratic worker, was stabbed.

At Jonesboro, Ill. John Kirby was shot and killed in an election quarrel.

At Wilmington, Del. in a row between white and colored voters a polling booth was wrecked, registration books destroyed and two men badly injured.

In various states arrests for illegal voting were made.

At Charlottetown and within St. James Hall there on Tuesday November sixth and at 11 o'clock a. m. which time and place the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met and was constituted, Mr. W. H. Spencer Moderator, with whom were present Messrs. Sutherland, John Gillis, Adam Gunn, Stewart, Eben Gillis, Campbell, McLeod, McLean, Fullerton, Millar, Herdman, McDonald, Craise, Robertson, McNeill and Layton Ministers, and Messrs. Lawson, Laird, and Thompson Ruling Elders.

Rev. J. M. McInnis of the Presbyterian Church of the United States was invited to correspond.

The minutes of meetings of August 7th and Sept. 11th were read and sustained.

Mr. D. B. McLeod introduced the following resolution which on his motion seconded by Mr. John, Gillis was unanimously adopted:

The Presbytery of Prince Edward Island recognizes the honor conferred upon it by the selection of one of its members Rev. T. F. Fullerton of Charlottetown, to represent the Presbyterian Church in Canada as Chaplain of the First Canadian Contingent, and also records its gratitude to God for his safe return and presence with us to-day after a year's service in South Africa.
