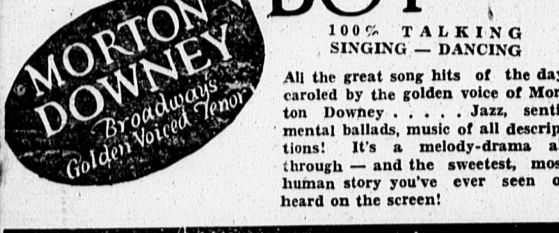

ISLAND LADY DEAD-Word was received by relatives in this city yesterday of the death in Sydney of Doris Lappin, daughter of Mr. Jack Lappin of the C. N. R. shops, Sydney and Mrs. Lappin. The deceased who was only 21 years of age was well known in this city where she graduated from the Commercial Department of Notre Dame Academy some five years ago. Her parents who are also well known here will have the sympathy of the entire community in their sad bereavement. BAD DRIVING-Yesterday following the sleet and the thaw which followed, motor traffic in the city was made extremely difficult. The snow, as it softened formed into a loose sand-like consistency through which the cars had to wallow and plunge, often skidding sideways. In much traversed streets, snow was thrown up into ridges between the car tracks, a condition which made walking very disagreeable at the street crossings. WINTER SERVICE-It is understood that when the regular double passenger and mail service between this province and the mainland ceases on Saturday, January 4th, the railway is proposing to have a mixed train run between Sackville and Tormentine. The train will leave Sackville at 6.30 p. m. after the arrival there of the Ocean Limited and is due to arrive at Tormentine at 8.15 p. m. The train returns to Sackville arriving back at 11 p. m. This service was attempted last year but owing to an accident to the car ferry it was discontinued a day or two after it was put in operation. SNOW PLOUGH ORDERED-Announcement is made of the purchase by the provincial government of a snow plough of a type similar to ones in use in United States and other parts of Canada, for winter operation over a number of the main roads leading to Charlottetown. The plough which was purchased in Toronto will arrive in the course of a few days. It is known as La Plante Choate V-plough and will be attached to one of the 30-horse power caterpillar tractors which the Government has been operating in connection with its road making operations. The new plough will cut a track 9 feet 1 inch wide which can be extended by the use of wings to 18 feet 5 inches. It is expected to be able to negotiate snowdrifts of considerable depth and should prove valuable in keeping the main highways open.
