To Form Baptist Federation At St. John Meeting

An historic meeting will be held in St. John, N. B., on December 7-8 for the purpose of forming the Baptist Federation of Canada. Representatives of the United Baptist Convention of the Maritime Provinces, the Baptist Convention of Ontario and Quebec and the Baptist Union of Western Canada, will gather in the German St. Baptist Church and there bring into being an organization which will prove of great significance in the religious life of Canada and the world.

This meeting, which marks the culmination of a movement which has for long been seeking a closer fellowship of the Baptists of Canada, in the summer of 1943 the three conventions appointed a committee to explore the possibilities of creating a national organization. A favorable report was received advocating its formation and outlining its constitution.

Each convention thereupon appointed members on its Council, and it is the meeting of this Council, which will be held on December 7-8, that will take place in St. John. The Council will organize the Federation, while the general assembly of the Federation will meet within three years.

Those who will meet next week in St. John as members of the Council, appointed by the Maritime Baptist Convention are: Rev. J. A. Gibson, Wolfville, President of Convention; Rev. W. C. Machum, St. John, General Secretary of the Convention; Rev. R. E. Whitney, Superintendent of Home Missions; Dr. R. S. Long, Wolfville; Rev. H. C. O'Brien, Amherst; Dr. G. C. Warren, Wolfville; Rev. John Linton, Sussex; Mr. K. A. Wilson, St. John; Mrs. G. Clark, St. John, representing the U. B. W. M. U.; and Rev. J. A. R. Thigley, Dartmouth, representing the B. Y. P. U. Convention.

From the Baptist Convention of Ontario and Quebec there are 10 members, and from the Baptist Union of Western Canada, there are 10 members. The former will be: Dr. S. H. Farmer, Dr. H. H. Bingham, Dr. G. Clark, St. John, representing the U. B. W. M. U.; and Rev. J. A. R. Thigley, Dartmouth, representing the B. Y. P. U. Convention.

Local Girl Weds Australian Air Force Officer

A very pretty wedding took place yesterday at the Bishop's residence in Charlottetown when Frances Philippa Bradley, only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Leo Bradley, 26 Great George Street, Charlottetown was united in marriage to Peter McLeod, of the Royal Australian Air Force, eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Edgar McLeod, 86 Woodside Ave., Stratfield, N.E.W. Australia.

The marriage was performed by the Rev. J. W. McCordale, of St. Dunstan's Basilica. The bride was attended by Miss Leona Trainor and the groom was supported by Mr. Aloysius Gaudet. After the ceremony a reception was held at the Charlottetown where a number of friends of the newly-married couple gathered at the breakfast table to wish both bride and groom many long years of happy married life.

The bride, wearing a reception of gold trimmed with brown fur and wore a corsage of yellow roses. The bridesmaid was attired in orange and wore accessories to match. The happy couple left by plane on their honeymoon at 6 o'clock yesterday evening for Montreal. They will also spend a few days in Ottawa and New York. They were accompanied to the Airport by a large number of friends who wished the newlyweds with confetti.

Mr. and Mrs. Paul Perry, North Market Street, Summerside, have received the telegram from the United States Navy Department advising them that their only son, Raymond Perry, seaman first class, is missing in action. The wife did not state where he was serving but his last letter was written from the Pacific waters. Mr. Perry took part in the invasion of Leyte and if this is so it would be his fifth invasion, beginning with the invasion of North Africa.

Seaman Perry has been in the U. S. Navy for five years. He is an American citizen, having been born here and coming to this Island with his parents as a child. He first tried to enlist with the Canadian Army but at that time they were not taking recruits. He is 22 years old. His only visit home for five years was last Christmas, when he was home for five days.

There should be no speculation as to when the war would end. The Germans were the toughest crooks ever turned out and they would hold out longer than most people thought. Mr. Churchill said he believed that the full amount of \$60,000,000,000 would be needed to rebuild the countries they have devastated. He understood Russia and Poland were being overrun by the Germans and they planned to give the Germans only food and lodging for doing the work.

He believed that many men returning from the front would be glad to go overseas in an infantry regiment to serve as reinforcements. About 50,000 or 75,000 men would be needed between now and next Easter. Men with long service overseas should be brought home to stay.

He believed that the command officers of the military districts across Canada, rather than Defence Minister McNaughton, should have reported to Parliament on the only trained men available for working. He had great respect for Gen. McNaughton but he did not believe he had done the right thing.
