Altitudes In Canada

OTTAWA, March 4.—In the orderly breaking up of a new country like Canada, the altitude or height above sea level of the site of any proposed development is of major importance. Consequently the provision in accessible form of information concerning exact levels is important and the task of providing such data is one of the duties of the Geodetic Survey of Canada, Department of the Interior.

In line with practically every country in the world, Canada has adopted mean sea level as its datum for altitudes. Sea level may be defined as the surface, which the water of the ocean would assume were it not acted upon by the attraction of the sun and the moon or disturbed by the wind. The actual determination of mean sea level at a primary tidal station is made by the Tidal and Current Division, Hydrographic Service, Department of Marine.

Hourly readings on an automatic gauge for a period of at least seven years are considered necessary for a trustworthy determination of mean sea level at a primary station. The Canadian precise level system is based on the determination of mean sea level at five primary stations namely, Halifax, Yarmouth, and Father Point on the Atlantic, and Vancouver on the Pacific. By means of precise levels sea level datum is carried inland so that today Canada's precise level system stretches from coast to coast and has a total extent of over 25,000 miles.

A series of publications by the Geodetic Survey constituting the third revision of "Altitudes in Canada" is now nearing completion. This series makes available to the general public a compendium of altitudes in an accessible form for ready reference and to the engineer a reliable supply of information on elevations for points which may be definitely located on the ground and which may serve as starting

Claim Cleopatra Buried In Paris

PARIS, March 4.—(A.P.)—Cleopatra is buried in Paris, says Mme. Myriam Harry, French historian and biographer of Egypt's Queen—and Napoleon Bonaparte is responsible.

Egyptologists accompanied the little Corporal when he invaded Egypt, according to Mme. Harry and Rene Le Gentil, French journalist. They found the Queen's tomb dug up by her mummy, and brought it back to Paris where they buried it with other mummies in the garden of the French National library it asserted.
