MURDERED MAN'S WIFE WAS AN ISLAND WOMAN

MONCTON, March 20.—Robert C. Moore who was reported shot to death by bandits in his home at Greenfield, Maine last Saturday night, it now appears was Robert C. Cadmore, a former resident of Moncton, and a native of Canada in the Parish of Moncton.

According to the story told by Mrs. Moore to the authorities two men entered the house, forced their way up stairs to a room where her husband was taking a bath and opened fire with revolvers. Five of the bullets took effect, one entering Moore's abdomen, two penetrating his chest, and two striking his arm.

Mrs. Moore said that as her husband fell unconscious the men fired at her. She was able to get to the outside door and shout for help and meanwhile the men ran off.

The murdered man has a number of brothers including Mr. Abel Cadmore of Canada.

Mrs. Cadmore, wife of the deceased, was formerly Miss Gault, of P. E. I. Besides the above mentioned relatives, a large number of other relatives reside in Moncton and Annapolis, Miss Sadie Cadmore, the N. B. Telephone exchange operator at the Hotel Brunswick is a niece.

Shortly after the alleged murder two men, stated to be Nova Scotians, were arrested, and charged with the crime. The motive is said to have been robbery. Mrs. Cadmore, who witnessed the shooting, was herself injured by a revolver bullet.
