(Continued from page one) \$2,742.63 was collected during the year from owners of property...

The amount of unpaid taxes is small, about the same as on previous years. I am convinced that the people here pay their taxes more readily...

The report of the Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply shows that the past year was the best they ever had.

About a mile and a half of concrete sidewalks were laid down during the year. This brings the total of concrete walk within the city up to about twelve miles.

A substantial increase was made to the pay of our firemen, I feel sure this will meet with the hearty approval of the citizens...

The Council passed a by-law providing for inspection of milk and cattle, etc., etc.

Under this by-law the majority of the milk vendors had their cattle tested with tuberculin...

The removal of the old jail and the unsightly fence surrounding it, earnestly desired by the citizens for many years, was accomplished...

The most notable civic event of the year was the visit of Field Marshal The Royal Highness, the Duke of Cornwall, Governor-General of Canada...

A vacancy at the Council occurred during the year by the removal from our city of Dr. McLaughlin...

The Council vacancy thus caused was filled by the election thereof of G. Dudley Wright, Esq.

I return my grateful thanks to you gentlemen of the City Council, as well as to the different city officials for the valuable aid rendered in successfully carrying on civic business of the year.

COLDEST DAY OF WINTER HITS BOSTON

BOSTON, Jan. 12--The coldest day which started in California and swept eastward struck Boston today...

It was Boston's coldest morning of the winter and of the young year. In the official report sent out from the Weather Bureau, the lowest temperature in Boston was twelve degrees above. This was between 7 and 8 o'clock.

The coldest spot in New England today was Greenville, Me., where the mercury went to 10 below.

The coldest place in America was Stoneville, Ontario, where the temperature was 26 below. Some of the official temperatures for the larger cities in the United States were: New York, 10 above; Chicago, 13 above; Boston, 12 above; Los Angeles, the warmest in the country, 42 above; San Francisco, 38 above; Philadelphia, 24 above; Washington, 24 above; Denver, 28 above; St. Louis, 22 above; and New Orleans, 40 above.

ANNIE GROSS GETS FIVE YEARS FOR MANSLAUGHTER

LONDON, Jan. 12--Mrs. Annie Gross, an American negro, was found guilty to-day of the manslaughter of Miss Jessie McIntyre, a young English actress, and was sentenced to five years penal servitude.

On the night of December 1 last Mrs. Gross, who lived in the same boardinghouse as Miss McIntyre, attempted to kill her husband, Harry Gross, a ragtime dancer. Miss McIntyre, who she alleged, had replaced her in her husband's affections, was present and a bullet struck and killed her.

The prisoner pleaded to-day that she fired at her husband, who was beating her, and that she did not see Miss McIntyre. She confessed she went to the house in Bloomsbury intending first to shoot her husband and then kill herself.

OUTTERS GO TO AID MONHEGAN.

PORTLAND, Me., Jan. 12--The steamer Monhegan of the Eastern Steamship Company's fleet, with twelve passengers on board, is disabled and drifting helplessly in a gale and high sea off Cape Small Point, eighteen miles from this city...

The steamer, which besides her passengers carried Captain Stanley and a crew of sixteen, left here at 7 o'clock this morning for Rockland. Apparently she had proceeded safely as far as the mouth of the Casco Bay. It was believed her steering gear or machinery are disabled.

The danger of her position lay in the fact that the steamer has been blown toward the ledge of Cape Small Point.

Word of the steamer's distress came after the lookout on the tower at the Humewell life saving station saw the steam from her whistle. In the heavy sea it was impossible for the life savers to put out. They sent word here and the Woodbury, at anchor in the harbor, hurried to the vessel's aid, with Herbert A. Clay, local manager of the Eastern Steamship Company, aboard. Wireless was also sent to the Androscoggin, cruising off the coast.
