THE LORD'S DAY ALLIANCE

Organization Found Everywhere but in Prince Edward Island.

(Ottawa Free Press.)

The Dominion Lord's Day Alliance will in the future contribute to the salary of the Ontario field secretary, Mr. J. G. Shearer. Mr. Shearer has been doing not only the work of the Ontario Alliance, but that of the Dominion as well. At the meeting in the Young Men's Christian Association, of the Dominion Lord's Day Alliance recently it was decided to contribute \$500 a year towards the salary of Mr. Shearer besides paying the expenses.

Rev. Mr. Shearer reported that he had travelled through Manitoba, Quebec, Northwest Territories and British Columbia recently. The receipts for the year were \$1,100 with an expenditure of considerably less leaving a balance on hand. He reported branches of the Alliance to have been organized everywhere but in Prince Edward Island.

Mr. W. M. Blake, of Montreal, representative of the Quebec Alliance stated that Archbishop Bucher and issued a manifesto which had great influence with the Roman Catholics of Montreal. He also gave an account of the closing of the French theatres on Sunday.

Reports were presented by Hon. Josiah Wood, of Moncton, New Brunswick and Hon. Wm. Ross, of Halifax, on the work done in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. The following officers were re-elected: President, Senator Allan. Vice-President Rev. D. M. Ramsay. Secretary, Rev. John Scanlon. Field Secretary, Mr. Geo. Hay. Mr. D. J. O'Donoghue was elected to fill the vacancy on the executive committee caused by the death of Rev. J. C. Campbell.

A convention will be held in Hamilton Tuesday, June 25th.

Rev. J. G. Shearer, secretary of the Dominion Alliance outlined the work of the Alliance and the ends which it was striving to attain. It was not, he stated designed to fill the churches but to obtain a needed day of rest in the week for the workingmen. He referred to the efforts of different nations "to do away with the Sabbath but without avail. He also advocated an eight hour day with a half holiday Saturday afternoons and stated that if the workingmen stood together they could receive as large wages for six days work as for seven days work.

CANADA MAY WIN

In the Great World's Search for the Pole

MANY NATIONS TRYING

One of the Most Remarkable Contests in Our Races History.

Owing to the success of the recent expeditions in search of the North Pole all nations are alert. In all parts of the world scientists have arisen to the emergency, and now with victory in sight it would be a struggle to the death to plant the flag at the earth's axis. No less than seven expeditions are being fitted out and will sail from as many ports. Practically unlimited means have been placed at the disposal of the explorers in other lands. Russia have placed unlimited means at the disposal of Admiral Markaroff, William Zeigler, a millionaire of New York is willing to spend one million five hundred thousand dollars to enable Erelrn B. Baldwin to plant the stars and stripes at the Pole. The Duke of Abruzzi who spend five hundred thousand dollars on his first expedition is prepared to spend twice as much if necessary to accomplish his purpose.

Undoubtedly the greatest factor in the world's race for the Pole is the expedition of Captain J. E. Bernier, of Quebec, a Canadian by birth, who has offered his services to his King and Canada gratuitously. The Captain's plans are unquestionably the best that have been conceived. They have been endorsed and approved by the Geographical Society of Quebec, the Colonial Institute of London, England, the Dominion and Provincial Governments, and have received the commendation of such authorities in arctic research as Sir Clements Markham, Dr. Bell of the Dominion Survey, J. W. Tyrell, chairman of committee on Polar research of Toronto and the late Dr. G. M. Dawson of the Geographical Survey.

The strongest testimony that can be

brought to bear in favor of Captain Bernier's expedition is the fact that his plans are fully in accord with nature while those of his competitors are in direct opposition to nature.

In view of the great interest manifested by Canadians in the Canadian Polar Expedition, it has been decided by the committee in charge of the Expedition, of whom His Excellency the Earl of Minto is Patron Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, President; Sir Clements Markham 1st Vice-President; and Hon. R. R. Dobbell, M. P., 2nd Vice-President and chairman, to immediately appeal to the Canadian Public for assistance in the shape of a popular subscription to supplement the grant given by the Dominion Government.
