School Board and National Service

A special meeting of the Board of School trustees was held yesterday afternoon at 1 o'clock.

There were present Henry Smith, Esq., Chairman; Dr. Jenkins, J. P. Gordon, Dr. McMillan, J. J. Johnston. The National Service League, represented by Messrs. D. A. McKinnon, James D. Stewart and W. S. Louison asked the co-operation of the Board in an effort to interest older boys of the City Schools in a campaign for increased farm production on P. E. I.

The following resolution was, after some discussion, unanimously adopted:—

RESOLVED: That the Board of School Trustees of Charlottetown having heard the Committee on production of the National Service League on the question of allowing boys of suitable age attending the public schools to volunteer for farm work in this Province during the planting season hereby approves of the proposal made to us, for the purpose of increasing our natural products for the benefit of the Empire, and the time so spent on farm work shall be considered as equivalent to attendance at school and shall not interfere with the grading of the pupils so engaged.
