Ross Sells Thompson To Detroit Club

BOSTON, Nov. 28 (AP)—The feelings of Cecil (Tiny) Thompson, the National Hockey League's all-star goalie, were soured by a \$1,000 bonus today when he learned that he had been sold by Boston Bruins to Detroit Red Wings for \$15,000 and another player.

Before heading into the mid-west to report to Jack Adams, the Detroit Manager, Thompson said: "As far as I am concerned, being traded by Boston to Detroit is a break for me. I should last a few more years there than I would in Boston and when I get to Detroit I'll be among such friends as owner Jim Norris, Manager Jack Adams and my old teammate, Marty Barry."

When he announced Thompson's sale to Detroit, one of the most important transactions in National Hockey League history, Manager Art Ross said that he would recall 23-year-old Frank Brimsek from Providence International-American Hockey League to take over his goal.

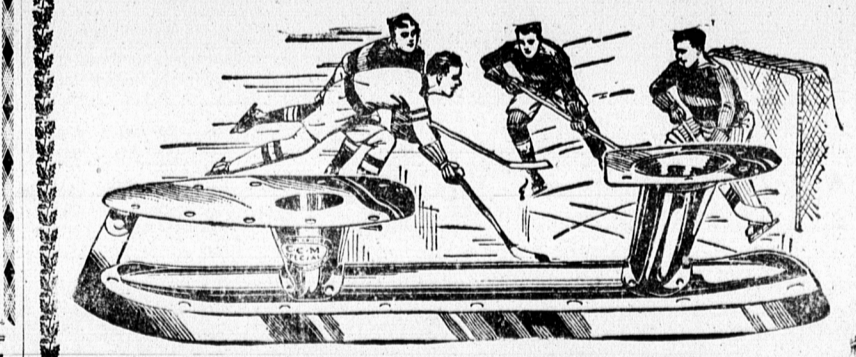
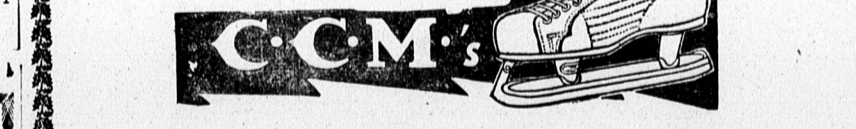
Remember When
