The champions, however, must look for trouble within their own state as North Carolina State displayed a team late in the season last year that carried increasing strength.

Tulane, Auburn, Georgia, Mississippi A. and M., Washington and Lee, South Carolina, Virginia Poly, University of Florida, Virginia Military Institute, Vanderbilt, Tennessee, Sewanee, Clemson, Maryland and Louisiana State are other conference members. Tournament play starts in Atlanta, February 25.

Well Known Horseman Dies In New Brunswick

SAINT JOHN, N. B., Dec. 6.—Peter Clinch, aged 72, former Secretary of the New Brunswick Board of Fire Underwriters, died suddenly yesterday while returning to the city by automobile with two friends from a visit to his summer cottage at Acamae. Heart failure is believed to have been the cause of his death. Mr. Clinch was widely acquainted in the Maritimes, Quebec and Ontario, as a horseman. Mr. Clinch officiated at many racing meets in Ontario and Quebec as a judge and starter. He was also a patron of boxing and participated in several amateur boxing bouts.

Oxford Women Crew

OXFORD, Dec. 6.—The international races which have in the past been held between the crews of Oxford University, and of Harvard and Yale, may in the future be replaced by races between Oxford and Wellesley, for a crew has been formed among the women students at the English university.

The "undergraduate eight" has been working out regularly on the Isis. It is reported they will row a race with the women students of Reading University on the Thames near Reading in the near future. A university regulation declares that women shall not take part in boat races, but to evade this rule the two crews will not start breast to breast.

Tennis Champion Collapsed After Winning Games

PORTLAND, Oregon, Dec. 6.—Susanne Lenglen, world tennis champion who collapsed after a stiff match with Miss Mary K. Browne here Saturday night, was sufficiently recovered from her fatigue yesterday, to board a train with the other members of the C. C. Pyle professional tennis party here yesterday. Forced to play 20 games of tennis before being able to down Miss Browne, the champion reeled from the courts and collapsed in her dressing room. Pyle announced that she was suffering from a severe cold.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., Dec. 6.—After rallying to tie the score in the third period of a National Hockey League game here Saturday night, the Boston Bruins continued their offensive in an extra period and defeated the Pittsburgh Pirates four to three. The winning goal was shot by Harry Oliver. Successive scores by Shore, Oliver and Herberts deadlocked the tally in the third period after Milks had added the Pirates' third goal early in the same period. Only two penalties, both minors, were handed out during the contest.

TORONTO, Dec. 6.—The flashy New York Americans made their initial invasion of the present National Hockey League season a very profitable one here on Saturday night when they outplayed and out-lucked St. Pats for a one goal to 0 victory in a league fixture. The game was a hard, close affair as the score indicates, but Verborghen, guarding the Americans' net, had far more dangerous shot to handle throughout than did Roach at the other end. For two periods the teams provided the fans with very mediocre hockey, interspersed with bits of thrilling play.
