**The Queen was Anxious.**

LONDON, Feb. 10.—The Queen's keen interest in Gen. Macdonald and the Highland Brigade was evidenced by the great concern she showed at the news of Macdonald's retirement from Koooodoober. Her Majesty sent special inquiries to the War Office, but as the officials had no knowledge of the movement up to midnight the Queen made her secretary telegraph twice to Beuter's News Agency, asking for the most minute details, whence the news came and who sent it, and requesting the earliest notification of any explanation received.

**Soudan Trouble not so Bad.**

CAIRO, Feb. 14.—Official investigation shows that only a few Egyptian officers, all of them young men, were involved in the trouble with the two Soudanese battalions, whom they had advised not to obey the order to give up cartridges. It seems that the implicated officers had become excited over Anglophobe articles published by The Liwa, which praised the Transvaal and advised the Egyptians to take advantage of British distractions in South Africa.

None of the senior officers are in any way implicated. A court of inquiry will sit immediately to investigate the affair.

**Russia Means Business.**

LONDON, Feb. 12.—The St. Petersburg correspondent of the Daily Mail, says: "The construction of the Trans-Persian railway has been absolutely decided upon. The line will be 1300 miles long, and will cost 150,000,000 roubles (Turkestans.) "The Viedomosti says the route will be from Dshulfa, by way of Tabreez, Hamadan Isphahan and Kerman, to Bander Abbas."
