EVELYN THAW HAS A DOUBLE

NEW YORK, July 7.—Evelyn Nesbit Thaw's statement that her double, Teddy Gerard, the pretty Broadway show girl, has been causing her trouble by masquerading here and abroad under her name, has brought under the wife of Harry Thaw, the bitter criticism of the rialto. Cables from Paris this week credited the latter with being responsible for a disagreement between E. R. Thomas and his wife.

Following the first and second Thaw trials, Thomas was much in the company of Evelyn Nesbit Thaw on one occasion being requested to leave the Hotel Knickerbocker with her, because of the unpleasant notoriety she earned in that case. Since his former associate in bank transactions here, now in Atlanta jail, the young millionaire has been living abroad.

Mrs. Thaw denies that she has been on the other side of the Atlantic with him and blames the Gerard girl for impermanenting her. With the evident intention of clearing herself with the Thaw family, which is keeping her liberally supplied with money, this week told some hitherto unknown secrets concerning the friendship of Thomas for her double, who is expected to stir up a big row between the show girl and her husband while it is said along the Kialto was not aware of the predilection of the banker for his wife.

NEW YORK, July 7.—In a report just issued for the year ended January 31st last, the Marconi Wireless Telegraph company, of New York, states that, allowing for the usual depreciation of 10 per cent, on station and experimental work, the balance shows that the company is richer more than self-supporting, but that the company from obtaining as many orders as in the previous year.
