The latest news, first of all.

Considerable dissatisfaction was heard expressed in Summerside yesterday when it was learned that the morning express from Charlottetown had been ordered to proceed direct to the boat, stopping only at the side of the wharf. This same order was in force several years ago, but owing to the dissatisfaction and inconvenience to passengers the order was revoked and the train has since been coming into the station before going to the boat.

A. McNeill, Chief of the Fruit Division, will address orchard meetings on Thursday June 17th in P. N. Pate's orchard, O'Leary at 3 o'clock, p. m. and on Friday June 18th in D. N. MacKay's orchard, Springfield, at 12 noon. There is no more enthusiastic fruit grower in Canada than Chief MacNeill. He knows the business and he is able to tell it to others in a forcible and convincing way. The busy season will be over by that time and these meetings should be well attended.

The annual convention of Prince County Institutes will be held in Summerside in the Market Hall on Tuesday and Wednesday, July 13 and 14. Among the questions that will come up for consideration are the holding of the Maritime Seed Fair in Summerside instead of in Amherst, raising the standard for clover seed, particularly Alaska, amendments to the Weed Act naming more weeds particularly those that are mentioned in the Seed Control Act and are not prevalent in this province; Scholarships for students in Agriculture; The curriculum of the Public Schools and the abolition of the Third Year in Prince of Wales College; and Superintendent of Institutes giving all his time to the Institute.

In the Supreme Court in Summerside yesterday morning, in the suit of James McDonald vs the International Harvester Co., the evidence of which had been taken the previous day. The Jury returned a verdict for the plaintiff for \$145, MacQuarrie K. C. for plaintiff, Saunders for defendant. The suit of D. R. Morrison, versus the water and sewerage commissioners of the town of Summerside was next taken up. Considerable time was taken in the selection of a jury. The case was opened for the plaintiff by Mr. Johnson, who called as his first witness, D. R. Morrison, the plaintiff. Mr. MacQuarrie for the defence objected to that part of the plaintiff's verbal evidence, varying on the written contract. The plaintiff's counsel contended that the evidence had no bearing on the written contract but for an independent contract. After considerable argument between the opposing counsel the evidence of Mr. Morrison was allowed to be given. When court adjourned at five thirty the direct examination of Mr. Morrison had not been completed.
