Ice Races Saturday

Zua Baughman Hangs up a New Record for Three Harts up the Season. Fastest Heat, 1.01. Equals Season's Record Made by Kentucky Mar-que Last Wednesday.

Saturday morning an ice race brought a good attendance despite the cold. A real March wind was blowing down the course, making it very uncomfortable for spectators. The ice was good and the wind rather helped than hindered the horses, as it was blowing from the rear. Zua Baughman drove by her owner, Mr. C. H. Benson, distinguished herself by coping the Class A race in three straight heats. The average time of which, 1.02, is the fastest average three heats of the season, while the time in the second heat, 1.01, exactly equals the Kentucky Mar-que's record, made last Wednesday, which, by the way, is the Maritime record for the season. Zua was in great shape and won each heat in impressive style and brought her second position, John R. having for second position, and finished in 1.04 1/2 but he was later than the first heat. The Class B was a mixed even, but took the full five heats to pick a winner. It was a really great race and fast time was made, particularly in the first heat, which was won by Nellie D., owned and driven by Mr. R. White, mare of 4th in 1.03, very fast time, and a performance which stamps her as a mare of class. Chief Aubrey made a showing in the second heat, which was captured in 1.04 1/2 but he was later than the first heat. The Class C was owned by Mr. H. H. Kelly, finally won out. Marjory, owned by Mr. Harry Murphy, showed an excellent fourth and fifth heat, finishing the fourth and fifth heats in 1.04 1/2 and 1.05 1/2.
