**IN MEMORIAM**  
**JEROME MCGUIGAN**

With sincere regret, it devolves on us to pay a week, very weak, silent tribute to the memory of one of the best beloved, prominent and valued members of St. Joseph's parish, Kelly's Cross. We refer to the late Jerome McGuigan, whose death took place on Sunday afternoon, October 12, 1930, in the Charlottetown Hospital.

Mr. McGuigan was a fine type of man physically, in the first and willing class of the hardy pioneers, his ancestors, who heaved a way and a home for themselves in the then "forests primeval" of that part of the country. "Jerome" by which brief term he was lovingly greeted by his hundreds of friends, was a hard-working, practical farmer, who followed the scriptural injunction to live "by the sweat of the brow," but it was the general opinion that he sacrificed his health and his life by his indifference to his comfort and in the anxious pursuit of the various details of farm work, which in his case, was carried on a large scale.

The deceased filled a large space in the religious, educational, political and social life of the community in Western Queens County during the past thirty-five years or more.

When any movement for the advancement of parish affairs loomed up, the leaders to rush that movement counted in the advance guard, Jerome McGuigan. He stood for everything that spelled progress in the district of school, being Trustee for a number of years at Kelly's Cross district.

He was an enthusiastic and hard-working adherent of the Conservative party in the First District, being
