TRAIL WINS SECOND ALLAN CUP GAME

Five Third Period Goals Gives Western Champions 8-2 Victory Over Cornwall

By LORNE BRUCE Canadian Press Staff Writer CALGARY, April 17—Five third-period goals gave Trail Smoke Eaters an 8-2 victory here Saturday night over Cornwall Flyers and a two-game lead in the Allan Cup hockey finals.

The British Columbia champions stood off Flyers' first period rush, took advantage of a big break in the second and then coasted to their second straight win in the best-of-five series.

The gallant eastern Canada titlists were beaten 6-4 in overtime in the first game at Saskatoon. The teams meet here again tomorrow. Dave Duchak paced the Trail attack. The pale-faced, 145-pound pivot thrilled a capacity crowd of more than 5,000 as he scored two goals and made passes for two more.

SHARED HONORS Jimmy Morris, hard-driving rearguard, shared sniping honors with two markers and one assist. Dick Kowcinak and Johnny McCreedy added one each. Bunny Dame and Ab Cronie got the other two.

Costly Penalty The big break in the game came late in the second with the score tied at 2-2 when Mike McMahon, 21-pound flyer rearguard, was punished for five minutes after he took out Mel Snowdon, Trail defenseman, on the face. After Perre had held off a shower of pucks the Smoke Eaters power play clicked.
