## Sport Echoes from Prince County

About this business of ejecting people from rinks for shouting insults at the referee: The problem seems to be just when a fan has overstepped the line and laid himself open for action by the police. Certainly fans should never shout personalities that will reflect on a referee in any particular way, if you know what we mean. Obscenities must also be sternly frowned upon. But the incident that brought this whole discussion up was one in which a group of fans kept chanting that a certain referee was crooked. Now if a fan ever gets ejected from a rink for this offense we want to be right on the spot when it happens so that we can wire it in to Ripley before anybody else gets ahead of us. Because such an action will be as rare as a mosquito netting in Newfoundland. Fans have called referees crooked for so long that it seems now the theme song that goes with the game.

All action must be judged in connection with its environment. You can with perfect propriety kneel behind a fellow and let another prankster push him over you if you are all sporting on the beach, but such a prank executed while going down the aisle of a church or even of a theatre would be condemned immediately by all the best families. At least, a great many pretty decent people do seem to get half their money's worth by shouting insults at a referee when his decision, quite often perfectly fair and just, puts their team at a disadvantage.

We must all remember that hockey rinks, like other locales, have their peculiarities of language. "Mr. Referee, don't you think you made a slight error in judgment on that last play?" translated into rink dialect would go something like this: "Why, you dirty prate, you're so crooked you could hide behind a corkerew." Of course, if you want to be a bit more subtle about it, you might roar at him: "Where is All Baba and the other thirty-nine?" or "Why don't you get a horse? Jesse James had a horse!" but most fans prefer to tell the referee what they think of him in language they are sure he will understand.

We'd like to end this discussion by congratulating our adversary, Carl Fitzpatrick, who has recently broken into the sports column game with his "Blue-Line Shuffles." His work is bright, witty and has the authentic sports flavor. We predict a future for this boy in the writing game and wish him luck in his venture.

**Truman Seeks More Aid For Greeks, Turks**

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16 (AP)—President Truman told Congress today he will ask more military help to strengthen Greece and Turkey against Communism. Greece in particular cannot be saved from Communist-engineered collapse until rebel forces "subservient to foreign influences" are wiped out, the President said. He was reporting to the \$300,000,000 program of military aid to Greece, and the \$100,000,000 for Turkey, voted by Congress last year to help both countries protect their freedom.
