From Pictou To Panama

Some four thousand people were gathered about the pier at Pictou yesterday to witness the departure of the saucy little boat "Pictou-to-Panama" which has actually started upon that long trip. She sailed bravely out of the harbor at an 8 knot clip.

The dimensions of the boat which are ridiculously small in comparison with the strenuous voyage ahead, are as follows:—keel, 8 ft. 6 in.; length over all, 16 ft.; beam, 4 ft. 10 in.; inside depth, 22 in.; rise, 4 in.; length of centre board, 3 ft. 6 in.; depth, 24 in.; mainsail, 6 ft. hoist boom, 12 ft.; gaff, 7 ft.; jib, 8 ft. hoist. Bullard, Arthur McKean, Pictou.

Capt. W. Scott in reply to a question as to the probable duration of the voyage, nonchalantly replied that the trip would take anywhere from ten months to two years. The captain is part owner of the boat, and is accompanied by the other owners, F. Maloney and F. Campbell, all of Pictou. It is reported that Scott and Campbell hail originally from Prince Edward Island. All three are experienced sailors and well able to take care of themselves.

Apart from the spirit of adventure which is the real attraction of the crew of the "Pictou-to-Panama" are hoping after their voyage to pick up some small change by exhibiting their boat over the country and by the sale of postcards, etc.

China Opposed to Renewal of Treaty NEW YORK, May 12.—China is seeking the support of public opinion in Canada and the British dominions to prevent the renewal of the Anglo-Japanese treaty, Bertram Lenox Simpson, adviser to the President of China and stationer to the Chinese Government (declared, in a statement made today here, that Mr. Simpson who recently arrived from Ottawa, where he discussed the treaty question with Premier Meighen and other members of the dominion cabinet said he had been commissioned by the Chinese government as its official spokesman in regard to the treaty.
