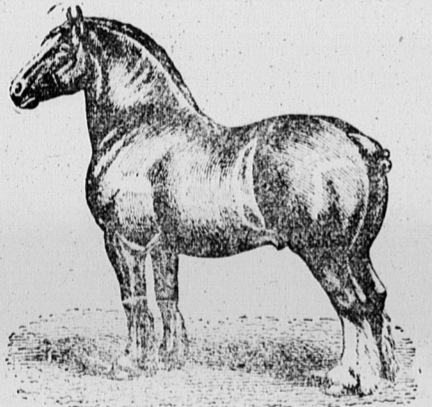
Champion Clydesdale Station of Eastern Canada

April 17. THE QUESTION OF JOHN THE BAPTIST. Matt. 11:1-19. GOLDEN TEXT.

"But the witness which I have is greater than that of John; for the works which the Father hath given Me to accomplish, the very works that I do, bear witness of Me, that the Father hath sent Me."—John 5:36 (R.V.)

POINTED SUGGESTIONS. By Rev. D. Snider.

The best qualification for effective leadership in constancy in effective service. When Jesus sent out the twelve upon their mission it was not that His burden should be lessened. He had His own itinerary, just the same.

John the Baptist not only furnishes a noble example of what it means to lose one's life for Christ's sake, but he also presents a most worthy example of the right course to pursue when one's reckoning of the integrity of another has suffered shock and is in danger of collapse. Go at once to headquarters with your question.

Circumstances favored John in his fear that Jesus was not up to the standard of his expectation, and from John's view-point that the Messiah of the kingdom would hew His way thither with axes it may readily be seen how the conduct and methods of Jesus differed from the methods of the Baptist. His imagination had suffered a twist, that is all. But though he thought he had a good case against Jesus, the course he takes is an example, for all time of decency and thorough-going manliness.

The Master understood him and could trust him. "Go and show John." That is all that is needed. Some men can read credentials; others cannot. Some men can understand the line in the letter that is underscored like the one in the message of Jesus, namely, "Blessed is he, whosoever shall not stumble in me." Others, however, at such words proceed to paint the larger and more dreadful heresy.

And Jesus began to describe some of that kind; childlike characters, unless the game is the one they are prepared to engage in, whether wedding or funeral, all is called off. John Baptist is too austere to Stationing Committee might put down, it was another kind they wanted.

Meantime Jesus knew how to commend the genuine and trust worthy character. And He forbids men to listen to His commendation and the mighty deductions which are at hand.

The greatest in native capacity and the noblest in honest endeavor, the very Elijahs of prophetic mission and power, do not thereby measure to the privilege of the kingdom of heaven.

Axes do not hew out the kingdom of heaven. It is the creation of a spirit—the Holy Spirit. And men are greatest of all when they are Spirit-filled.

But that does not reduce those who attain to the kingdom of heaven or belong to it, or preach it, to pulpy penitents. They, too, are men of resolution and daring, and of dauntless determination and fiery consecration.

They say such things as that the world should be evangelized in this generation. They say we can and we will: hence organization and literature and offerings and consecrated manhood placed on the altars of God. They say, "We love, because He first loved us." And the world must be conquered for Christ.
