### ANCIENT METAL CLOCK

The pile even included a 300-lb. cast iron letter press, according to a report made to National Salvage Headquarters.

Many of us this winter will have to depend upon small oil or gas stoves to help out in the heating situation due to the war. A healthy atmosphere is maintained if a pan of water is placed on top of or close to the stove whenever it is lighted.

One-third cup fruit-juice added to each two cups of prepared mince-meat gives a richer flavor.

To make your windows shine, wash them, then wipe them over with newspaper.

GREASELESS CREAM A new greaseless cream has been developed by du Pont chemists to protect women's hands and arms from crime and irritants. The new

cream forms an invisible protective film which at the end of the day can be washed off with soap and water. It is hoped that the new cream will reduce the incidence of occupational skin diseases.

Remove insects by placing in water to which salt or vinegar has been added.

Wash thoroughly use a brush for root vegetables. Pare carefully for much of the mineral content lies near the surface. Scraping is best.

Do not leave pared vegetables standing in cold water for any length of time.

When cooking vegetables in water: Have water boiling when vegetable is put in and keep it boiling constantly.

The shorter the cooking period, the less loss there is in mineral matter and vitamins. Avoid overcooking. If vegetables must stand, take from stove when cooked, drain and re-heat just before serving. Remember cook only until tender. Serve immediately.

### WASHING WOOL STOCKINGS

Wool stockings should not shrink if they are guaranteed washable and handled with care. Before washing, measure your foot and stretch the length of the stocking—unless you use a foot form for drying. Use a solution of mild soap and lukewarm water and gently squeeze the stockings through the solution. Do not rub or twist them or you may injure the wool fibre. After washing, rinse them thoroughly in clear lukewarm water and roll in a towel that will absorb the excess moisture. Then stretch the stockings out to fit the original measurements and dry them on a flat surface.

### SPICY MINCEMEAT

- 3 cups finely chopped suet
- 1 orange
- 3 cups water
- 4 cups cooked prunes
- 8 cups chopped apples
- 1-2 cups chopped mixed peel
- 4 cups white sugar
- 1-2 cups brown sugar
- 3 cups fruit juice
- 3-4 cup vinegar
- 3-3 cup dark molasses
- 2 tablespoons salt
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 5 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1-2-2 teaspoons cloves
- 1 tablespoon nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon allspice

Method: Combine to suet, sliced orange and lemon (slice the fruit through the rind and pulp), and the water and boil together for about 40 minutes. Remove the orange and lemon slices. Wash the raisins well and drain them out the prunes from the pits in small pieces. Chop the apples finely then measure them. Cut the rest in small pieces. Combine all the chopped fruits and add to the cooked suet and liquid, along with the white and

### WASHABLE GLOVES

Tip: On How To Launder If your gloves are guaranteed washable (never wash them if they're not), these washing rules are suggested for both fabrics and leathers. Make a rich suds of a mild soap in that is so lukewarm it's almost cool. Wash the gloves either on or off your hands. It's all right to soak white gloves, but soaking may streak colors. Rinse in clear, lukewarm water. You'll get better

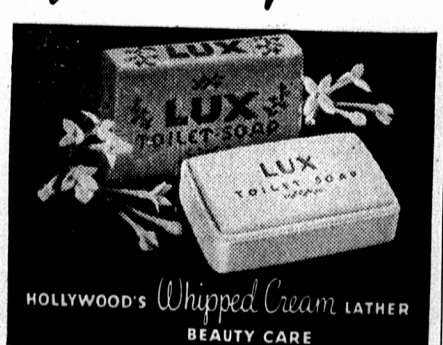
