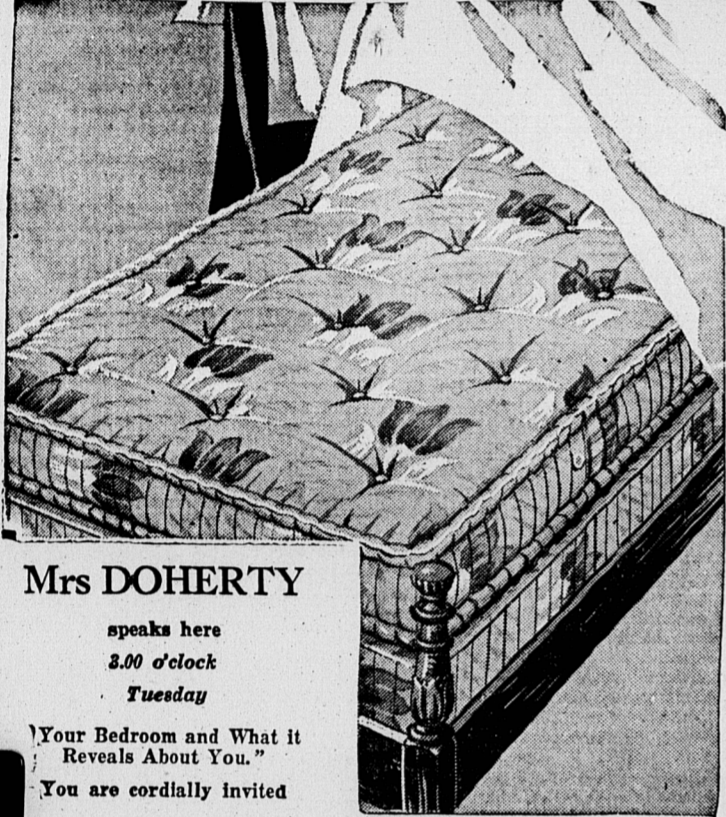

SKIN DISORDERS IN HOGS
