Supplementing THE GUARDIAN's short, but to the point remarks regarding the Y. M. C. A.'s physical entertainment Monday evening last, the following words may not be out of place.

Mr. A. W. Robb the genial and manly Secretary and Physical Instructor, of our Y. M. C. A. left Tuesday morning to attend his brother's marriage. In his absence, let me briefly place before the good people of Charlottetown a little of what Mr. Robb is trying to accomplish in our midst.

The Y. M. C. A. has not been, as aggressive as it might have been of late years and perhaps this in a good measure has been caused by the citizens of Charlottetown not taking enough interest or giving same, the financial support this good institution requires.

In hundreds of Cities throughout the civilized world and in many foreign lands the Y. M. C. A. is, and has been for the greatest good, spiritually mentally and bodily of young men.

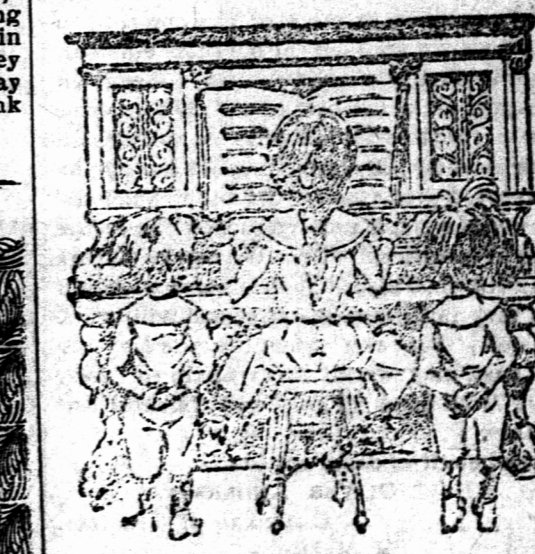
