Report of the High Court I.O.F.

HIGH SECRETARY'S REPORT. SUMMERSIDE, Sept. 5th, 1917. TO THE HIGH CHIEF RANKED OFFICERS AND MEMBERS.

Dear Companions and Brethren:— Another year in our Forensic history has passed, and as required by the Constitution I here submit a report of what has been accomplished since September

1916, in our jurisdiction. First—No. of Courts last year 43 Instituted during the year 3

No. of Courts at present 45 No. of officers last year 1046 Initiated during the year 94 Admitted by card 25 Reinstated 9

First Total, 274 No. Suspended 65 Withdrawn by Card 42 Died 14

Second Total, 121 No. of Insured members, July 1st 1033 No. of Social and Honorary Members 49

Total Members, 802 We have eighteen Courts in Prince County with 801 members; seventeen in Queens County with 730 members; and ten in Kings County with 402 members.

As to condition of our Courts, I am in a position to say that they are as a whole, and in many places in better working order than ever. The large number of members absent from the Province makes the meetings difficult to keep up. There are other reasons for the Courts not meeting as often as we would wish, but this is true of all societies similar to ours.

The two new Courts recently organized promise to be among our best. Court Dreamworld, has already, at considerable expense, fitted up a hall of their own, which is one of the best Lodge rooms in the county. This early action on the part of its members will give the Court free rent, and a home-like place to meet. Court Alysbury has had a social from which they realized over twenty-five dollars, thus placing the finances in good shape from the beginning.

SECOND—As to the securing of new members, we all agree that it is not as easy as it formerly was. We have fewer people than we had ten years ago. Our available material—our young men—are going away, and while we get a few the day before they go, there is so much red-tape, they say, about getting into the Order that the matter (of more importance to the young man who is leaving home than he imagines) is put off to a more convenient season. Besides, our Medical Board is placing a heavier hand upon applicants than formerly. The papers that would be passed by the Medical Board ten or fifteen years ago are now rejected. In eight years 180 applicants from this Province, all declared to be first class risks by the Medical Examiners have been refused by the Medical Board. If you will add to this number those whom the local doctors have rejected you will have quite an army of uninsured.

BUILDING STRIKE TIES UP HAVANA

HAVANA, Cuba, Sept. 3.—Four thousand buildings under construction or about to be constructed, were abandoned yesterday when the masons struck demanding the payment of their wages in American money. The police are guarding the buildings, with orders to stop all meetings near them or interference by strikers with masons willing to work.

The cigar makers are supporting the masons and will contribute part of their wages to the strikers' fund. This may be the beginning of a general move for American money, expected since the cigar makers' strike.
