GOLD RUSH AT IDITAROD.

IDITAROD CITY, Alaska, June 1, via Kaitag, Alaska, June 6.—Three hundred and fifty prospectors, the new Iditarod gold fields, arrived from Fairbanks yesterday; after a three weeks' trip down the Yukon river.

All say that the stampedie will be the greatest since the famous rush to Klondike 13 years ago, but many old-time gold seekers are pessimistic over the prospects for getting sudden wealth from the gravel along the banks of the Iditarod and the Inukjuag rivers. Estimates place the number of prospectors who will arrive during the early summer at 5000.

Many say that the summer camp will not support more than 1000 miners, as only seven miles of pay dirt have been found, and that none is extraordinary. It is believed that at least half of those in the main camp, Iditarod City, will turn back to the Iditarod, where they expect to build a camp, 50 miles across the divide.

At present, Iditarod City consists of a few cabins. No wharf has been built and freight is dumped on the ground.

LT. SHACKLETON MAY TAKE TRIP TO NORTH.

OTTAWA, June 4.—There is a possibility that Lieut. Sir Ernest Shackleton, the famous Antarctic Explorer, who is now in the Canadian West, may accompany Earl Grey on his trip through the Canadian hinterland and Hudson Bay next August. His Excellency has invited Lieutenant Shackleton to accompany him, and it is understood that the latter is now considering whether or not he can arrange his other engagements on the lecture platform so as to allow him to take the trip.


