Three crates of foxes, one for Howland's ranch at Milton and two for Angus Shea, Summerside, were among the shipments by the P. E. I. R., Charlottetown yesterday.

The Rev. Father Powell, S.S.J.E. gave his first address at St. Peter's Cathedral, Charlottetown, on Wednesday evening his subject being Learning the Christ. His remarks were followed with great attention by a large congregation. Yesterday afternoon he gave a most impressive address to women of the study of the bible. He preaches again to-night at 7.30 and on Sunday at 11 and at 7 o'clock.

There will be a public meeting in the North River Baptist Church next Sunday evening, at 7 o'clock. The meeting will be under the auspices of the W. M. A. S., and will consist of exercises by the young people, short addresses, and special music. An interesting service may be expected. All are welcome.

The Rev. E. C. Hennigar, who has been a missionary in Japan for seven years, is expected to preach in Charlottetown on Sunday, Nov. 24th, in the morning in the First Methodist Church and in the evening in Grace Methodist Church, and to speak at meetings in Montague Monday, Nov. 25th; Mount Stewart, Tuesday, 26th; Souris, Wednesday, 27th; York, Thursday, 28th.

Wednesday was the last day on which applications were received for leases of barren bottom for oyster culture in Richmond Bay. There were 250 applicants, each of which is restricted to five acres, so that 1250 acres, an area almost as large as the present beds in the bay, have been disposed of. It is the intention of the Government to open up St. Mary's Bay, North River and other areas, to the public as soon as the surveys are made, giving local people a month in which to make their selection.

Everyone is cordially invited to the Thankoffering Meeting of the St. James' Church Auxiliaries of the W. F. and H. M. S., on Friday evening, Nov. 22nd, at 8 o'clock. The speaker will be Mrs. A. W. Thomson of Picton, the new President of the Society. Mrs. Thomson possesses unusual qualifications as a Missionary leader. Her addresses are full of strength and inspiration, and she speaks with the intimate knowledge of one who has spent the greater part of her life on the Foreign Mission field, first as the daughter of the revered and beloved Dr. Morton, and later as the wife of Rev. Mr. Thomson of Trinidad.

The last of a highly creditable series of Exhibitions this year was held in York Hall Wednesday under the auspices of Excelsior Institute. The Hall has recently been considerably enlarged and improved. The building has been lengthened at the eastern end and fitted with stove, shelves, which fill enables the ladies of the district to provide refreshments at the social gatherings, and besides afford an ante-room for performers. There was a large attendance of the people of the neighborhood, together with Hon. Murdoch MacKinnon, Commissioner of Agriculture, Professor Ross, Secretary of Agriculture, Mr. T. A. Clark, Superintendent of the Experimental Farm, Rev. Father McGuigan, President of the Queens County Seed Fair Association, Rev. Mr. Westmoreland, Dr. McDonald, and others interested in Prince Edward Island agricultural advancement. The articles on exhibition were first-class, highly creditable to the members of Excelsior Institute and to the farmers of York and their wives. Indeed the most highly finished products were those of the ladies. York has the distinction of possessing the first Women's Institute in the Province—the Alpha Institute—and its members had a special exhibit of their own, in which the staff of life was set forth in perfection, together with other exceedingly attractive examples of Domestic Science.
