NEW YORK, N. Y., July 6.—The market opened firm yesterday and the industrial section of the list continued to advance quietly through the day. Some issues made very satisfactory gains. The rails and utilities were sluggish, the break in wheat as a result of good crop prospects and the decision of Canada to dispose of its surplus holding soon did not disturb stocks. Int'l Harvester, Montgomery Ward and Sears all were up on the day. The Dow Jones Industrial average at 120.60 closed very near its previous closing high of 120.75 on June 22.

The recent closing high on the rail average 33.93 on June 18 compared with 32.62 last night. The market seems to act rather well and the volume picks up another step in the advance could be initiated.

MONTEAL, July 7.—Butter and cheese prices advanced fractionally on the Montreal dairy and produce markets. Old potatoes were a little easier. Exporters for the week totalled 6,752 boxes of cheese, three boxes of butter, and 160 cases of eggs. The butter market ended the week at 20 to 20 1/2 cents per pound for cartons or 10 to 11 cents for retailers were quoted at 20 cents for solids and 22 cents for fat prints. Receipts were 24 boxes.

Cheese was 10 1/2 to 11 cents for no 1 cur Ontario and 10 to 10 1/2 cents for Quebec. Receipts were 30,175 boxes against 29,630 the preceding week.

Grated shipments of eggs in cartons of 15 lbs 2 1/2 to 2 1/2 cents for A-large, 20 to 21 cents for A-medium, 19 1/2 to 20 cents for B, and 17 1/2 to 18 cents for C.

New potatoes were \$1.25 to \$1.60 for Quebec in 50-pound bags and \$1.50 per barrel and \$1.50 per hamper for Ontario. Old potatoes were 35 to 40 cents for Quebec whites, and 50 to 60 cents for Green Mountain Maritime stock, per 80 pound bag.
