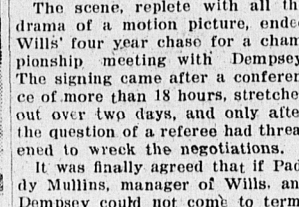
NEW YORK, Oct. 1.—Wall street betting commissioners have made the Pittsburgh club the favorites over the Washington club in the forthcoming world series.

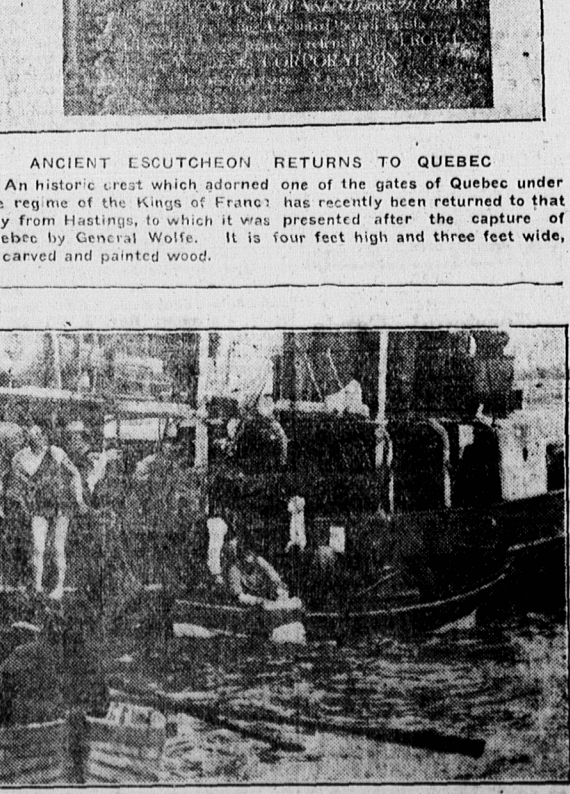
