Voices Good Wishes For Successful Conference In Charlottetown Today And Tomorrow

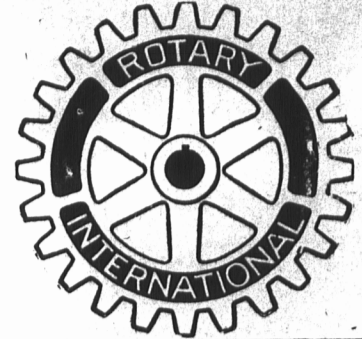
Prince Edward Island is pleased to receive the delegates attending the Second International District Conference of the Rotary Club, which is being held in Charlottetown this year.

acquired with one another in business but proficient in thoughtfulness of and helpfulness to each other. Following a university career and extensive travel in his native United States as well as abroad, the young attorney-at-law had finally sought practice in Chicago and found the reception a cold one.

Convinced he had the right idea, he explained his plan to a few acquaintances and an organization meeting was held in the office of one Gustavus Loehr, one of the founders, in February, 1905. Two weeks later a second meeting took place at Harris' establishment and organization was completed at a third meeting.

Harris suggested Rotary as the name of the club, due to the meetings being held in rotation at the different places of business of the members. General application of the "golden rule" for better business practices, loftier ideals in professional intercourse, service to one's community, state, province or nation, and development of international understanding and peace evolved from that early start.

RAPID GROWTH
Rotary expanded rapidly from its first national convention at Chicago with 16 clubs and 1,500 members in 1910 to the 20th convention in 1929.

It cannot, however, be too plainly stated that nothing in this "single classification" principle means the exclusion of business rivalry in order to afford non-competitive opportunity for business among fellow members. Rotarians are specifically forbidden to attempt to use the privilege of membership for commercial advantage. The honor of the movement in this particular respect is jealously guarded by the general body of members.

HOW IT WORKS

Fundamentally, Rotary and its unit, the Rotary club are an organization for the stimulation and education of that kind of business and professional man who is in sympathy with its objects. Its general policy, therefore, is not to advance its objects by means of corporate commitments or standpoints, but to do so by an educative program which is designed to make the individual member more bent on service and better equipped to carry it out.

The organization does suggest this or that appropriate channel; but it leaves the member free to take such channels as appeal to him best.

For example, while it is realized that the best work to be done in advancing service in vocation is probably by the individual becoming an active member of his trade

or professional organization and seeking to guide it in accordance with Rotary principles, it does not corporately lay it down that a good Rotarian should necessarily thus act, since there are Rotarians to whom such organizations are anathema. Generally speaking, however, Rotary does believe in corporate effort through appropriate ad hoc institutions.

Under the "Aims and Objectives Plan" the Club Service Committee seeks to cultivate the spirit of fellowship within the club and to provide the technique or machinery by which the club functions.

The Vocational Service Committee emphasizes the personal responsibility of every member in and through his vocation to carry out his service to the public in accordance with the highest standards of business integrity.

The Community Service Committee deals with his responsibility as a citizen. It urges him, according to his special interest or qualification, to apply himself to the various problems and activities, social, cultural, and recreational, for the betterment of the community. Rotarians are particularly encouraged to seek opportunities to take an active part in local administration on statutory and voluntary bodies.

The International Service Committee aims at stimulating the Rotarian's interest in world affairs, for the advancement of "inter-

national understanding, good will, and peace," and at helping him to make those contacts and friendships which will so benefit him as a citizen of the world.

WHERE IT IS

Each Rotary club is a direct member of Rotary International which is governed by an international board of directors elected at the annual convention.

Rotary International publishes two monthly magazines: "The Rotarian" in English, "Revista Rotaria" in Spanish. Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland publishes a monthly magazine, "The Rotary Wheel," and a quarterly review, "Service in Life and Work". In addition to these there are some 29 other Rotary periodicals published in 16 different languages by districts or regional groups of clubs.

Rotary clubs usually meet on a week day other than Saturday. Members who are travelling are always urged to attend where possible a weekly meeting of the club in any city in which they find

themselves on the appropriate day.

The first Rotary club was formed in Chicago in 1905. With the organization of a club in Winnipeg, Canada, in 1910 and clubs in Dublin, Ireland, and London, England, in 1911 the world-wide extension began. Since 1914, clubs have been formed in at least one new country or geographical region each year. Most recently entered territories are represented by the Rotary Club of Alexandria, Alexandria; Damascus, Syria; Nicosia, Cyprus; and Khartoum, Anglo-Egyptian Sudan.
