Presents, even as to-day, of little comforts as well as necessities came pouring in, and last, but not least, Florence Nightingale, with her staff of 92 trained nurses, arrived at Scutari on their errand of mercy, bringing joy and comfort and peace where before had reigned only misery, combining military precision with tender warmth of heart and impulsive kindness, and winning all hearts with whom she came in contact. Kinglake says: "Whilst she thus had great weight with the men in authority her ascendant held good with the orderlies and all other soldiers whose energies, whose patience, whose loyal devotion she often had to task hard. During all of that dreadful period, no one of them failed in obedience, in ready attention in thoughtful considerate delicacy. For her sake they toiled and endured beyond the measure of all that official words of command could well have sought to exact; yet, 'never,' she gratefully wrote, 'came from any of them one word or one look which a gentleman would not have used; and while paying this humble tribute to humble courtesy, the tears come into my eyes as I think how, amidst scenes of loathsome disease and death, there arose above it all the innate dignity, gentleness, and civility of these men, preventing instinctively the use of one expression which could not be uttered in the presence of a gentleman.'—London Evening Standard.
